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Part-I

1. Invitation to Bid:

- 1.1. "SBI Payment Services Private Limited" (hereinafter referred to as "SBI Payments") is a subsidiary of State Bank of India established with the objective of carrying out Merchant Acquiring Business activities. This Request for Proposal has been issued by SBI Payments for "Empanelment of vendors for Supply of Sound Box devices (QR) with Terminal Management System (TMS)".
- 1.2. In order to meet the requirements of Soundbox Devices (QR) and TMS, SBI Payments proposes to invite Bids from eligible Bidders with detailed technical proposal on Supply of Soundbox Devices (QR), its Accessories and TMS as per details / scope of work mentioned in **Annexure-C** of this RFP.
- 1.3. Bidder shall mean any entity (i.e., juristic person) who meets the Minimum eligibility criteria given in **Annexure-B** of this RFP and willing to provide the product and Services as required in this RFP. The interested Bidders who agree to all the terms and conditions contained in this RFP may submit their Bids with the information desired in this RFP.
- 1.4. Address for submission of Bids, contact details including email address for sending communications are in Part II of this RFP document.
- 1.5. This RFP document shall not be transferred, reproduced, or otherwise used for purposes other than for which it is specifically issued.
- 1.6. Interested Bidders are advised to go through the entire document before submission of Bids to avoid any chance of elimination. The eligible Bidders desirous of taking up the project for supply of proposed product and services for SBI Payments are invited to submit their technical proposal in response to this RFP. The criteria and the actual process of evaluation of the responses to this RFP and subsequent selection of the successful Bidder will be entirely at SBI Payments' discretion. This RFP seeks proposal from Bidders who have the necessary experience, capability & expertise to provide SBI Payments the proposed services adhering to SBI Payments' requirements outlined in this RFP.

2. Disclaimer:

2.1. The information contained in this RFP document or information provided subsequently to Bidder(s) whether verbally or in documentary form/email by or on



behalf of SBI Payments, is subject to the terms and conditions set out in this RFP document.

- 2.2. This RFP is not an offer by SBI Payments, but an invitation to receive responses from the eligible Bidders. No contractual obligation whatsoever shall arise from the RFP process unless and until a formal contract is signed and executed by a duly authorized official(s) of SBI Payments with the selected Bidder.
- 2.3. The purpose of this RFP is to provide the Bidder(s) with information to assist preparation of their Bid proposals. This RFP does not claim to contain all the information each Bidder may require. Each Bidder should conduct its own investigations and analysis and should check the accuracy, reliability and completeness of the information contained in this RFP and where necessary obtain independent advice/clarifications. SBI Payments may in its absolute discretion, but without being under any obligation to do so, update, amend or supplement the information in this RFP.
- 2.4. SBI Payments, its employees and advisors make no representation or warranty and shall have no liability to any person, including any Applicant or Bidder under any law, statute, rules or regulations or tort, principles of restitution or unjust enrichment or otherwise for any loss, damages, cost or expense which may arise from or be incurred or suffered on account of anything contained in this RFP or otherwise, including the accuracy, adequacy, correctness, completeness or reliability of the RFP and any assessment, assumption, statement or information contained therein or deemed to form or arising in any way for participation in this bidding process.
- 2.5. SBI Payments also accepts no liability of any nature whether resulting from negligence or otherwise, howsoever caused arising from reliance of any Bidder upon the statements contained in this RFP.
- 2.6. The issue of this RFP does not imply that the SBI Payments is bound to select a Bidder or to appoint the Selected Bidder or Concessionaire, as the case may be, for the Project and the SBI Payments reserves the right to reject all or any of the Bidders or Bids without assigning any reason whatsoever.
- 2.7. The Bidder is expected to examine all instructions, forms, terms and specifications in the bidding document. Failure to furnish all information required by the bidding document or to submit a Bid not substantially responsive to the bidding document in all respects will be at the Bidder's risk and may result in rejection



of the Bid.

3. Definitions:

In this connection, the following terms shall be interpreted as indicated below:

- 3.1. "SBI Payments" means SBI Payment Services Private Limited incorporated under the Companies Act, 2013 and having its registered office at 23rd Floor, Urmi Estate, 95, Ganpatrao Kadam Marg, Opp Peninsula Business Park, Lower Parel, West, Mumbai 400 013.
- 3.2. "Bidder/Vendor/System Integrator" means an eligible entity/firm submitting the Bid in response to this RFP.
- 3.3. "Bid" means the written reply or submission of response to this RFP.
- 3.4. "The Contract" means the agreement entered into between the SBI Payments and the Vendor, as recorded in the Contract Form signed by the parties, including all attachments and appendices thereto and all documents incorporated by reference therein.
- 3.5. "Vendor/Service Provider" is the successful Bidder found eligible as per eligibility criteria set out in this RFP, whose Bid has been accepted as per the selection criteria considering Reverse Auction set out in the RFP and to whom notification of award has been given by SBI Payments.
- 3.6. "The Contract Price/Project Cost" means the price payable to the Vendor under the Contract for the full and proper performance of its contractual obligations.
- **3.7.** "The Contract period" means the duration of the empanelment or any extended duration as per agreed terms.
- 3.8. "The Equipment / Product" means all the Hardware along with it's all components, associated software/firmware/operating software which the Vendor is required to supply to the SBI Payments under the Contract / RFP."
- 3.9. "Work / Services" means all those services ancillary to the supply of the , equipment/product, such as transportation, transit insurance customization, integration, provision of technical assistance, training, maintenance and other such obligations of the Vendor covered under the Contract.



- 3.10. "The Project" means Empanelment of vendors for supply of Sound Box devices (QR) with TMS, if required for the contract period.
- 3.11. "The Project Site" means locations where supply and services as desired in this RFP document are to be provided.
- 3.12. "The OEM" means Original Equipment Manufacturer.

4. Scope of Work:

As given in **Annexure-C** of this document.

5. Eligibility Criteria, Technical and Functional Specifications

- 5.1. Bid is open to all Bidders who meet the eligibility criteria, Technical and functional specifications as given in **Annexure-B and Annexure B3** of this document. The Bidder has to submit the documents substantiating eligibility criteria as mentioned in this RFP document.
- 5.2. No Bidder or its associate shall submit more than one Bid for the Scope of Work as desired under this RFP. A Bidder applying individually or as an associate shall not be entitled to submit another Bid either individually or through associates, as the case may be.
- 5.3. The Bidder who is the Principal/OEM only itself is allowed to Bid.
- 5.4. Bidder (Principal/OEM) shall not submit a Bid on behalf of another Principal/OEM under the RFP.
- 5.5. The Bidder shall also submit PRE-CONTRACT INTEGRITY PACT (Annexure-P) along with technical Bids as prescribed by the Govt. of India, duly signed by the Bidder on each page and witnessed by two persons. The agreement shall be stamped as applicable in the State where it is executed. Bid submitted without PRE-CONTRACT INTEGRITY PACT, as per the format provided in RFP, shall not be considered.

6. Cost of Bid document:

The participating Bidders shall bear all the costs associated with or relating to the preparation and submission of their Bids including but not limited to preparation, copying, postage, delivery fees, expenses associated with any demonstration or presentations which may be required by SBI Payments or any other costs incurred



in connection with or relating to their Bid. SBI Payments shall not be liable in any manner whatsoever for the same or for any other costs or other expenses incurred by a Bidder regardless of the conduct or outcome of the bidding process.

7. Clarification and amendments to RFP/Pre-Bid Meeting

- 7.1. Bidder requiring any clarification of the bidding document may notify the SBI Payments in writing **strictly as per the format given in Annexure-O** at the **address/by e-mail given in part II** of this document within the date/time mentioned in the schedule of events.
- 7.2. A pre-Bid meeting will be held on the date and time specified in the schedule of events which may be attended by the authorized representatives of the Bidders interested in responding to this RFP.
- 7.3. The queries received (without identifying source of query) and response of SBI Payments thereof will be posted on the SBI Payments' website or conveyed to the Bidders via e-mail.
- 7.4. SBI Payments reserves the right to seek clarification from the bidders through email.
- 7.5. SBI Payments reserves the right to amend, rescind or reissue the RFP, at any time prior to the deadline for submission of Bids. SBI Payments, for any reason, whether, on its own initiative or in response to a clarification requested by a prospective Bidder, may modify the bidding document, by amendment which will be made available to the Bidders by way of corrigendum/addendum. The interested parties/Bidders are advised to check the SBI Payments' website / e-mails regularly till the date of submission of Bid document specified in the schedule of events/email and ensure that clarifications / amendments issued by the SBI Payments, if any, have been taken into consideration before submitting the Bid. Such amendments/clarifications, if any, issued by the SBI Payments will be binding on the participating Bidders. SBI Payments will not take any responsibility for any such omissions by the Bidder. SBI Payments, at its own discretion, may extend the deadline for submission of Bids in order to allow prospective Bidders a reasonable time to prepare the Bid, for taking the amendment into account.
- 7.6. No request for change in commercial/legal terms and conditions, other than what has been mentioned in the RFP or any addenda/corrigenda or clarifications issued in connection thereto, will be entertained and queries in this re-



gard, therefore will not be entertained.

7.7. Queries received after the scheduled date and time will not be responded/acted upon.

8. Contents of bidding document:

- 8.1. The Bidder must thoroughly study/analyze and properly understand the contents of this RFP document, its meaning and impact of the information contained therein.
- 8.2. Failure to furnish all information required in the bidding document or submission of Bid not responsive to the bidding documents in any respect will be at the Bidder's risk and responsibility and the same may finally result in rejection of its Bid. SBI Payments has made considerable effort to ensure that accurate information is contained in this RFP and is supplied solely as guidelines for Bidders.
- 8.3. Nothing in this RFP or any addenda/corrigenda or clarifications issued in connection thereto, is intended to relieve Bidders from forming their own opinions and conclusions in respect of the matters contained in RFP and its addenda, if any.
- 8.4. The Bid prepared by the Bidder, as well as all correspondences and documents relating to the Bid exchanged by the Bidder and SBI Payments including supporting documents and printed literature shall be submitted in English.
- 8.5. The Information provided by the Bidders in response to this RFP will become the property of SBI Payments and will not be returned. Incomplete information in Bid document may lead to non-consideration of the proposal.

9. Earnest Money Deposit (EMD):

- 9.1. The Bidder shall furnish EMD for the amount and validity period mentioned in Part II of this document.
- 9.2. EMD is required to protect the SBI Payments against the risk of Bidder's conduct.
- 9.3. The EMD shall be in the form of a Bank Guarantee [on the lines of Annexure-I], issued by a Scheduled Commercial Bank in India, drawn in favour of SBI Payment Services Pvt Ltd payable at Mumbai.



- 9.4. Any Bid not accompanied by EMD for the specified amount and not submitted to the SBI Payments as mentioned elsewhere in the RFP will be rejected as non-responsive.
- 9.5. The EMD of the Unsuccessful Bidders shall be returned within 1 month from the date of Bid finalization.
- 9.6. The EMD of successful Bidder will be discharged upon the Bidder signing the Contract and furnishing the Performance Bank Guarantee for the amount and validity as mentioned in Part II of this RFP) which should be strictly on the lines of format placed at **Annexure-J**.
- 9.7. No interest is payable on EMD.
- 9.8. The EMD may be forfeited: -
 - If a Bidder withdraws his Bid during the period of Bid validity specified in this RFP; or
 - ii. If a Bidder makes any statement or encloses any form which turns out to be false / incorrect at any time prior to signing of Contract; or
 - iii. If the successful Bidder fails to sign the contract or furnish Performance Bank Guarantee, within the specified time period in the RFP/Purchase Order.
- 9.9. If EMD is forfeited for any reasons mentioned above, the concerned Bidder may be debarred from participating in the RFPs floated by the SBI Payments/this department, in future, as per sole discretion of SBI Payments

10. Exemption of EMD and Tender Fee

- 10.1. Micro & Small Enterprises (MSE) units and Start-ups are exempted from payment of EMD and tender fee provided the Services they are offering, are rendered by them. Exemption as stated above is not applicable for providing services, rendered by other companies.
- 10.2. Bidder should submit supporting documents issued by competent Govt. bodies to become eligible for the above exemption.
- 10.3. Bidders may please note:



- NSIC certificate/ Udyog Aadhar Memorandum/ Udyam Registration Certificate should cover the items tendered to get EMD/tender fee exemptions. Certificate/ Memorandum should be valid as on due date / extended due date for Bid submission.
- ii. "Start-up" company should enclose the valid Certificate of Recognition issued by Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT),(erstwhile Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion), Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Govt. of India with the technical bid.
- iii. Start-ups which are not under the category of MSE shall not be eligible for exemption of tender fee.
- iv. Bidder who solely on its own, fulfils each eligibility criteria condition as per the RFP terms and conditions and who are having MSE or Start-up company status, can claim exemption for EMD/ tender fee.
- v. If all these conditions are not fulfilled or supporting documents are not submitted with the technical Bid, then all those Bids without tender fees
- vi. EMD will be summarily rejected and no queries will be entertained.

11. Bid Preparation and submission:

- 11.1. The Bid is to be submitted in one envelope which is to be prominently marked as 'Technical Proposal for Empanelment of vendors for supply of sound box devices (QR) in response to the RFP No. SBI Payments/VM/2025-26/13 dated 29.09.2025. This envelope should contain the following documents and be properly sealed:
 - Bid covering letter/Bid form on the lines of Annexure-A on Bidder's letter head.
 - ii. Tender fee as specified in this document.
 - iii. Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) as specified in this document.
 - iv. A letter on Bidder's letterhead:
 - a) Mentioning details of EMD submitted, technical competence and experience of the Bidder.



- b) Certifying that the period of the validity of the Bid is as per terms of this RFP.
- c) Confirming that the Bidder has quoted for all the items/services mentioned in this RFP in their technical Bid.
- d) Confirming that they agree with all the terms and conditions mentioned in the RFP.
- e) Specific response with supporting documents in respect of Eligibility Criteria as mentioned in Annexure-B, and Technical Eligibility Criteria on the lines of Annexure-B2, Annexure B3 and Annexure B4.
- v. Bidder's details as per **Annexure-D** on Bidder's letter head.
- vi. Undertaking of Authenticity Annexure-G
- vii. Any deviations sought from technical criteria/specifications given in RFP.
- viii. Audited balance sheets and profit and loss account statement for any Three (3) out of the last Four (4) financial years.
- ix. A copy of board resolution and power of attorney (POA wherever applicable) showing that the signatory has been duly authorized to sign the Bid document.
- 11.2. Detailed technical specification and explanation of functioning of Product/License/Software/firmware.
- 11.3. Technical Bid must not contain the price information. Such a proposal, if received, will be rejected.

11.4. Bidder may please note:

- i. The Bidder should quote for The Bidder should quote for the entire package on a single responsibility basis for Product & Services it proposes to provide.
- ii. While submitting the Technical Bid, literature on the Hardware, services and its associated operating software/firmware should be segregated and kept together in one section / lot in a separate envelope.
- iii. Care should be taken so that the Technical Bid shall not contain any price in-



formation. Such a proposal, if received, will be rejected.

- iv. The Bid document shall be complete in accordance with various clauses of the RFP document, or any addenda/corrigenda or clarifications issued in connection thereto, duly signed by the authorized representative of the Bidder and stamped with the official stamp of the Bidder. Board resolution authorizing representatives to Bid and make commitments on behalf of the Bidder is to be attached.
- v. Bids are liable to be rejected if Technical Bid is not received.
- vi. Post empanelment, commercial bids shall be called from the empaneled vendors under Rate Contract. Prices quoted by the Bidder shall remain fixed for the period specified in rate contract document and shall not be subjected to variation on any account, including inflation, exchange rate fluctuations and custom duty. A Bid submitted with an adjustable price quotation will be treated as non-responsive and will be rejected.
- vii. If deemed necessary, SBI Payments may seek clarifications on any aspect from the Bidder. However, that would not entitle the Bidder to change or cause any change in the substances of the Bid already submitted or the price quoted.
- viii. The Bidder may also be asked to give a presentation for the purpose of clarification of the Bid.
- ix. The Bidder must provide specific and factual replies to the points raised in the RFP.
- x. The Bid shall be typed and signed by the Bidder or a person or persons duly authorized to bind the Bidder to the Contract.
- xi. All the enclosures (Bid submission) shall be serially numbered with rubber stamp of the participating Bidder's company. The person or people signing the Bids shall initial all pages of the Bids, except for un-amended printed literature.
- xii. Any inter-lineation, erasures or overwriting shall be valid only if these are initialed by the person signing the Bids.
- xiii. The Bid document shall be spirally bound.



- xiv.SBI Payments reserves the right to reject Bids not conforming to above.
- xv. The NON-WINDOW envelope consisting the technical bid shall be sealed.
- xvi.All the envelope shall be addressed to SBI Payments and delivered at the address given in Part-II of this RFP and should have name and address of the Bidder on the cover.
- xvii. If the envelope is not sealed and marked, SBI Payments will assume no responsibility for the Bid's misplacement or its premature opening.

12. Deadline for Submission of Bids:

- 12.1. Bids must be received by the SBI Payments at the address specified and by the date and time mentioned in the "Schedule of Events".
- 12.2. In the event of the specified date for submission of Bids being declared a holiday for the SBI Payments, the Bids will be received up to the appointed time on the next working day.
- 12.3. In case the SBI Payments extends the scheduled date of submission of Bid document, the Bids shall be submitted by the time and date rescheduled. All rights and obligations of the SBI Payments and Bidders will remain the same.
- 12.4. Any Bid received after the deadline for submission of Bids prescribed will be rejected and returned unopened to the Bidder.

13. Modification and Withdrawal of Bids:

- 13.1. The Bidder may modify or withdraw its Bid after the Bid's submission, provided that written notice of the modification, including substitution or withdrawal of the Bids, is received by the SBI Payments, prior to the deadline prescribed for submission of Bids.
- 13.2. A withdrawal notice may also be sent by email, but followed by a signed confirmation copy, not later than the deadline for submission of Bids.
- 13.3. No modification in the Bid shall be allowed, after the deadline for submission of Bids.
- 13.4. No Bid shall be withdrawn in the interval between the deadline for submis-



sion of Bids and the expiration of the period of Bid validity specified by the Bidder on the Bid Form. Withdrawal of a Bid during this interval may result in the forfeiture of EMD submitted by the bidder.

13.5. Withdrawn Bids, if any, will be returned unopened to the Bidders.

14. Period of Validity of Bids:

- 14.1. Technical bids shall remain valid for 180 days from the last date of submission of bid. A Bid valid for a shorter period is liable to be rejected by the SBI Payments as non-responsive.
- 14.2. In exceptional circumstances, SBI Payments may solicit the Bidders' consent to an extension of the period of validity. The request and the responses thereto shall be made in writing. A Bidder is free to refuse the request. However, in such case, SBI Payments will not forfeit its EMD. However, any extension of validity of Bids will not entitle the Bidder to revise/modify the Bid document.
- 14.3. SBI Payments reserves the right to call for fresh quotes at any time during the Bid validity period, if considered, necessary.

15. Bid integrity:

Willful misrepresentation of any fact within the Bid will lead to the cancellation of the contract without prejudice to other actions that the SBI Payments may take. All the submissions, including any accompanying documents, will become property of SBI Payments. The Bidders shall be deemed to license, and grant all rights to SBI Payments, to reproduce the whole or any portion of their product for the purpose of evaluation, to disclose the contents of submission to other Bidders and to disclose and/ or use the contents of submission as the basis for RFP process.

16. Bidding process/Opening of Technical Bids:

- 16.1. All the technical Bids received up to the specified time and date will be opened for an initial evaluation on the time and date mentioned in the schedule of events available in part II of this document. The technical Bids will be opened in the presence of representatives of the Bidders who choose to attend the same. However, Bids may be opened even in the absence of representatives of one or more of the Bidders.
- 16.2. In the first stage, only technical Bid will be opened and evaluated. Proposals



of such Bidders satisfying eligibility criteria and agree to comply with all the terms and conditions specified in the RFP, will be evaluated for technical criteria/specifications/eligibility. Only those Bids complied with technical criteria shall become eligible for further RFP evaluation process.

- 16.3. SBI Payments will examine the Bids to determine whether they are complete, required formats have been furnished, the documents have been properly signed, EMD for the desired amount and validity period is available and the Bids are generally in order. SBI Payments may, at its discretion waive any minor non-conformity or irregularity in a Bid which does not constitute a material deviation.
- 16.4. Prior to the detailed evaluation, SBI Payments will determine the responsiveness of each Bid to the bidding document. For purposes of these Clauses, a responsive Bid is one, which conforms to all the terms and conditions of the bidding document in to, without any deviation.
- 16.5. SBI Payments' determination of a Bid's responsiveness will be based on the contents of the Bid itself, without recourse to extrinsic evidence.
- 16.6. After opening of the technical Bids and preliminary evaluation, some or all the Bidders may be asked to make presentations on the hardware, operating software/firmware proposed to be offered by them.
- 16.7. If a Bid is not responsive, it will be rejected by the SBI Payments and will not subsequently be made responsive by the Bidder by correction of the nonconformity.

17. Evaluation Process:

- 17.1. The competitive bids shall be submitted in two stages:
 - Stage 1 (for empanelment) Technical Evaluation, comprising of Eligibility Cum Technical Bid [As part of Empanelment]. Only two qualified bidders shall be awarded the empanelment contract based on technical scoring (H1 and H2)
 - ii. Stage 2 (for empaneled vendors) Commercial Bid Evaluation [As part of Rate Contract requirement], subjected to Reverse Auction.



18. Technical Evaluation:

- 18.1. Technical evaluation will include technical information submitted as per technical Bid format, demonstration of proposed solution / product / services, reference calls and site visits, wherever required. The Bidder may highlight the noteworthy/superior features of their proposed solution/product/services. The Bidder will demonstrate/substantiate all claims made in the technical Bid to the satisfaction of the SBI Payments, the capability of the product to support all the required functionalities at their cost in their lab or those at other organizations where similar product is in use.
- 18.2. SBI Payments reserves the right to evaluate the Bids on technical & functional parameters including factory / workplace visit and witness demos of the system and verify functionalities, response times, etc.
- 18.3. During evaluation and comparison of Bids, SBI Payments may, at its discretion ask the Bidders for clarification on the Bids received. The request for clarification shall be in writing and no change in prices or substance of the Bid shall be sought, offered or permitted. No post Bid clarification at the initiative of the Bidder shall be entertained.
- 18.4. The Technical Proposal will be evaluated for technical suitability and subject to proof of concept (PoC) to ensure compatibility with existing setup or new setup proposed by the bidder.
- 18.5. Technical evaluation will be based on Annexure B2, Annexure B3 and Annexure B4 of this RFP document.

18.6. Proof of Concept (POC) for Sound Box devices (QR)

- i. All the vendors who are found to fulfil the eligibility criteria and qualifying the technical evaluation criteria as part of this empanelment RFP have to supply, install and integrate the Sound Box devices quoted in the tender (same make & model/s) with the existing setup of the SBI Payments or on the new setup proposed by the bidder. The device needs to be delivered at SBI Payments location (23rd Floor, Urmi Estate, 95, Ganpatrao Kadam Marg, Opp. Peninsula Business Park, Lower Parel West ,Mumbai, Maharashtra–400013 / or any other location as informed by the SBI Payments) for testing purpose within one week from the date of intimation by the SBI Payments.
- ii. The POC is to ensure the technical suitability and compatibility with the ex-



- isting setup of SBI Payments or new setup and the requirements detailed as part of the Scope of Work.
- iii. SBI Payments shall give an overall time of 15 working days as part of the POC which shall include successful integration of the supplied device with existing setup of SBI Payments.
- iv. Any vendor who is not complying with the above POC will be technically disqualified at the discretion of the SBI Payments. The eligibility and technically qualified bidders will be empaneled for a period of three years. Separate empanelment for the three Product Lines namely:
 - a) Product Line 1 Sound Box Static QR
 - b) Product Line 2: Sound Box Static QR with NFC
 - c) Product Line 3: All in one Sound Box (Tap, Dip & Dynamic QR)
- v. Option will be given to the bidders to participate in any or all of the Product Lines as part of empanelment RFP for empanelment purpose.
- 18.7. The SBI Payments reserves the right to accept or reject any tender in whole or in parts without assigning any reason thereof. The decision of the SBI Payments shall be final and binding on all the vendors to this document and SBI Payments will not entertain any correspondence in this regard. The vendor would need to provide supporting documents for eligibility and technical proof. All the credentials of the vendor necessarily need to be relevant to the INDIAN market.
- 18.8. Vendors who meets the eligibility criteria, technical criteria and selection criterial would only qualify as empaneled vendors.
- 18.9. The product to be supplied as offered by the Bidder should have been delivered / deployed to Scheduled Commercial Bank / Financial Institution /Fintech/ Govt. Org / PSUs in India. The Bidder should furnish the details

19. Evaluation of Price Bids and Finalization:

19.1. The commercial quotes are not required to be submitted at the time of tender submission by the bidders.



- 19.2. Once the vendors are empaneled, the commercial bids will be called through Reverse Auction every year or as and when SBI Payments desires from the empaneled vendors.
- 19.3. A Rate Contract model shall be adopted during the empaneled period where PO shall be released based on estimates or business requirement. Commercial quote should be submitted through online / Offline mode, as and when SBI Payments seeks commercials.
- 19.4. The rankings of the vendors shall be based on the outcome of the reverse auction.
- 19.5. Contract will be awarded between L1 & L2 vendors in the ratio of 65:35 respectively. An offer will be made to L2 bidder to match the price quoted by the L1 and in case, L2 refuses to accept the said offer, SBI Payments reserves the right to award the entire contract to **L1**.

20. Defaults committed by Bidders:

- 20.1. If the L1 / L2 bidder defaults for 3 orders or more in any of the Rate Contract phase, SBI Payments will have the discretion to approach the L1 / L2 vendor (other than the defaulted vendor) of that Rate Contract phase for additional quantity. In case if L1 and L2 both shows inability to perform as per the rate contract terms for any reasons, SBI Payments reserves the right to approach any other vendor for the procurement of Soundbox and its solutions.
- 20.2. Those Bidders who are empaneled and do not submit the commercial quote for the Rate Contract phase, SBI Payments has the discretion to disqualify them from empanelment process and thereafter the said bidders may not be eligible to participate in any of SBI Payments requirement during the empanelment period. The Security Deposit submitted by the vendor will be forfeited.

21. Errors, if any, in the price breakup format will be rectified as under:

21.1. In the event where commercial bids are called by SBI Payments from the empaneled vendor, during submission of the commercial bids if there is a discrepancy between the unit price and total price which is obtained by multiplying the unit price with quantity, the unit price shall prevail and the total price shall be corrected unless it is a lower figure. If the Bidder does not ac-



cept the correction of errors, the Bid will be rejected

- 21.2. If there is a discrepancy in the unit price quoted in figures and word, the unit price in figures or in words, as the case maybe, which corresponds to the total Bid price for the Bid shall be taken as correct.
- 21.3. If the vendor has not worked out the total Bid price or the total Bid price does not correspond to the unit price quoted either in words or figures, the unit price quoted in words shall be taken as correct.

22. Contacting the SBI Payments:

- 22.1. No Bidder shall contact the SBI Payments on any matter relating to its Bid, from the time of opening of Price Bid to the time, the Contract is awarded.
- 22.2. Any effort by a Bidder to influence the SBI Payments in its decisions on Bid evaluation, Bid comparison or contract award may result in the rejection of the Bidder's Bid.

23. Award Criteria:

- 23.1. The empanelment of shortlisted vendors shall be declared by SBI Payment.
- 23.2. Once the vendors are empaneled, the commercial bids will be called every year or as and when SBI Payments desires from the empaneled vendors and a Rate Contract model shall be adopted.
- 23.3. As part of the Rate Contract, SBI Payments proposes to award the contract to two successful bidders, in the ratio of 65:35 on the basis of commercial bid submitted in the Reverse Auction process. The Successful L1 bidder will get 65% of the order and L2 will get 35% of the order. Price of L1 Bidder has to be matched by L2 Bidder.
- 23.4. SBI Payments will notify successful Bidder(s) in writing by way of issuance of purchase order or Letter of Intent through letter or email that its Bid has been accepted. The selected Bidder has to submit acknowledgment of order confirmation via email of the same to SBI Payments within 3 working days.
- 23.5. The successful Bidder will have to submit Non-disclosure Agreement (wherever applicable), a Performance Bank Guarantee for the amount and validity as desired in part II and strictly on the lines of format given at **Annexure-N** and annexure J respectively of this document together with acceptance of



all terms and conditions of RFP.

- 23.6. Copy of board resolution and power of attorney (POA wherever applicable) showing that the signatory has been duly authorized to sign the acceptance letter, contract and NDA should be submitted.
- 23.7. The notification of award will constitute the formation of the Contract.
- 23.8. The successful Bidder shall be required to enter into a Service Level Agreement (SLA)/Contract with the SBI Payments and submit the Bank Guarantee, within 2 week issuance of Purchase Order or such extended period as may decided by SBI Payments.
- 23.9. Until the execution of a formal contract, the RFP, along with the SBI Payment's notification of award by way of issuance of purchase order or Letter of Intent and Vendor's acceptance thereof, would be binding contractual obligation between SBI Payments and the successful Bidder.
- 23.10. The contract/ agreement will be based on Bidder's offer document with all its enclosures, modifications arising out of clarifications etc. and will include SLA, project plan phases & milestones and schedule, copies of all necessary documents, licenses, certifications etc.
- 23.11. SBI Payments reserves the right to stipulate, at the time of finalization of the Contract, any other document(s) to be enclosed as a part of the final Contract.
- 23.12. Failure of the successful Bidder to comply with the requirements/terms and conditions of this RFP shall constitute sufficient grounds for the annulment of the award and forfeiture of the EMD and/or PBG.
- 23.13. Upon notification of award to the successful Bidders, SBI Payments will promptly notify and release a letter of empanelment to the successful Bidders through email. The EMD of each unsuccessful Bidder will be discharged and returned.

24. Powers to Vary or Omit Work:

24.1. No alterations, amendments, omissions, additions, suspensions or variations of the work (hereinafter referred to as variation) under the contract shall be made by the successful Bidder except as directed in writing by SBI



Payments. SBI Payments shall have full powers, subject to the provision herein after contained, from time to time during the execution of the contract, by notice in writing to instruct the successful Bidder to make any variation without prejudice to the contract. The finally selected Bidder shall carry out such variation and be bound by the same conditions as far as applicable as though the said variations occurred in the contract documents. If any, suggested variations would, in the opinion of the finally selected Bidder, if carried out, prevent him from fulfilling any of his obligations under the contract, he shall notify SBI Payments in writing with reasons for holding such opinion and SBI Payments shall instruct the successful Bidder to make such other modified variation without prejudice to the contract. The finally selected Bidder shall carry out such variation and be bound by the same conditions as far as applicable as though the said variations occurred in the contract documents. If SBI Payments confirms its instructions, the successful Bidder's obligations shall be modified to such an extent as may be mutually agreed, if such variation is substantial and involves considerable extra cost. Any agreed difference in cost occasioned by such variation shall be added to or deducted from the contract price as the case may be.

- 24.2. In any case in which the successful Bidder has received instructions from SBI Payments as to the requirements for carrying out the altered or additional substituted work which either then or later on, will in the opinion of the finally selected Bidders, involve a claim for additional payments, such additional payments shall be mutually agreed in line with the terms and conditions of the order.
- 24.3. If any change in the work is likely to result in reduction in cost, the parties shall agree in writing so as to the extent of change in contract price, before the finally selected Bidder(s) proceeds with the change. In all the above cases, in the event of a disagreement as to the reasonableness of the said sum, the decision of the SBI Payments shall prevail.

25. No Waiver of SBI Payments Rights or Successful Bidder's Liability:

Neither any sign-off, nor any payment by SBI Payments for acceptance of the whole or any part of the work, nor any extension of time, nor any possession taken by the SBI Payments shall affect or prejudice the rights of SBI Payments against the finally selected Bidder(s), or relieve the finally selected Bidder(s) of his obligations for the due performance of the contract, or be interpreted as approval of the work done, or create liability in the SBI Payments to pay for alterations/ amendments/



variations, or discharge the liability of the successful Bidder(s) for the payment of damages whether due, ascertained, or certified or not or any sum against the payment of which he is bound to indemnify the SBI Payments nor shall any such certificate nor the acceptance by him of any such amount paid on account or otherwise affect or prejudice the rights of the successful Bidder against SBI Payments.

26. Change in Orders:

- 26.1. SBI Payments may, at any time, by a written order given to the Vendor, make changes within the general scope of the Contract in any one or more of the following:
 - i. Place of delivery.
 - ii. License Categories (if any)
- 26.2. If any such change causes an increase or decrease in the cost of, or the time required for the Vendor's performance of any provisions under the Contract, an equitable adjustment shall be made in the Contract Price or delivery schedule, or both, and the Contract shall accordingly be amended. Any claims by the Vendor for adjustment under this clause must be asserted within 15 days from the date of Vendor's receipt of SBI Payments' change order.

27. Contract Amendments:

No variation in or modification of the terms of the Contract shall be made, except by written amendment, signed by the parties.

28. SBI Payments' Right to Accept Any Bid and to Reject Any or All Bids:

SBI Payments reserves the right to accept or reject any Bid in part or in full or to cancel the bidding process and reject all Bids at any time prior to contract award, without incurring any liability to the affected Bidder or Bidders or any obligation to inform the affected Bidder or Bidders of the grounds for the SBI Payments' action.

29. Documentary Evidence Establishing Bidder's Eligibility and Qualifications:

On acceptance of the Bid by the SBI Payments, the Bidder needs to submit the undertaking of authenticity on the lines of **Annexure-G** along with documentary evidence of their eligibility/qualifications to perform the Contract to the SBI Payments' satisfaction:



- i. that in case of a Bidder offering to supply products and/or services mentioned in the scope of work, the Bidders need to provide a self declaration that Bidder itself is the OEM.
- ii. that adequate, specialized expertise are available with the Bidder to ensure that the services are responsive, and the Bidder will assume total responsibility for the fault-free operation of the product proposed and maintenance thereof during the support (warranty/annual maintenance contract, if desired) period.

30. Performance Bank Guarantee:

- 30.1. Performance Bank Guarantee [PBG] of the amount with validity period specified in Part II of this RFP strictly on the format at **Annexure-J** is to be submitted by the finally selected Bidder. The PBG has to be issued by a Scheduled Commercial Bank and needs to be submitted within the specified time of receipt of formal communication from the SBI Payments about their Bid finally selected. Payment of the value of the Purchase Order will be released only after receipt of the Performance Bank Guarantee.
- 30.2. The PBG is required to protect the interest of the SBI Payments against delay in supply/installation and or the risk of unsuccessful implementation of the project, or performance of the material or services sold, which may warrant invoking of PBG. In case any act of the supplier results in imposition of Liquidated Damages then also SBI Payments reserves the right to invoke the PBG.

31. Country of Origin / Eligibility of Goods & Services:

- 31.1. All equipment and components thereof to be supplied under the Contract shall have their origin in eligible source countries, as per the prevailing Import Trade Control Regulations in India.
- 31.2. For purposes of this clause, "origin" means the place where the goods are mined, grown, or manufactured or produced, or the place from which the related product is supplied. Goods are produced when, through manufacturing, processing or substantial and major assembly of components, a commercially-recognized product results that is substantially different in basic characteristics or in purpose or utility from its components.



32. Delivery, Packaging, Branding & Documentation:

- 32.1. The devices would be required to be delivered to the TSPs (Technology Vendor / service provider(s) of SBI payments at their godowns or to any other locations as per TSPs'/ SBI Payments' requirement. The minimum delivery quantity will be in multiples of 50 devices per location. The payments would be released only after acknowledgement is received at SBI Payments from TSPs/SBI Payments designated staff regarding receipt of the consignments at the locations.
- 32.2. The Vendor shall provide such packing of the products as is required to prevent its damage or deterioration during transit thereof to the location given by SBI Payments. The packing shall be sufficient to withstand, without limitation, rough handling during transit and exposure to extreme temperature, salt and precipitation during transit and open storage. Size and weight of packing cases shall take into consideration, where appropriate, the remoteness of the Product's final destination and the absence of heavy handling facilities at all transit points.
- 32.3. The Branding of the device and of the packaging will be in accordance with SBI Payments.
- 32.4. Delivery, and commissioning of the equipment shall be made by the Vendor in accordance with the approved / ordered and within the time schedule given in the Scope of work given in Annexure-C of this document.
- 32.5. The delivery will be deemed complete when the equipments/ components/ associated software/firmware are received in good working condition at the designated locations, mentioned in part II of this RFP.
- 32.6. The installation will be deemed to be completed, when the product including all the hardware, accessories/components, firmware/system software, and other associated software have been supplied, installed and operationalized as per the technical specifications and all the features as per the technical specifications are demonstrated and implemented as required, on the systems, to the satisfaction of SBI Payments. The Bidder has to resolve any problem faced during installation and operationalization.
- 32.7. In addition, vendor will supply all associated documentation relating to the products/hardware, system software/firmware, etc. The product(s) are considered accepted (commissioned and operationalized) after signing the Ac-



ceptance Test Plan (ATP) document jointly by the representative of SBI Payments and the vendor after supply and installation of Sound Box devices. In case of discrepancy in the implementation, SBI Payments reserves the right to cancel the entire purchase contract and the vendor should take back their equipment at their costs and risks. The test will be arranged by the vendor at the sites in the presence of the officials of SBI Payments and / or its consultants.

- 32.8. Penalties as specified in Annexure-L will be applicable for the any kind of default in delay in delivery, commissioning/support etc. expected in scope of work which will be deducted at the time of making payment(s).
- 32.9. In addition to the penalty on delayed supplies, SBI Payments also reserves the right to cancel the Purchase Order and forfeit the EMD. In the event of such cancellation, the vendor is not entitled to any compensation, whatsoever. SBI Payments reserves the right to allocate the undelivered order of defaulting bidders to other shortlisted bidders at its discretion.
- 32.10. For the System & other Software/firmware required with the hardware ordered for, the following will apply:
 - i. The vendor shall supply standard software/firmware package published by third parties in or out of India in their original publisher-packed status only, and should have procured the same either directly from the publishers or from the publisher's sole authorized representatives only
 - ii. The Vendor shall provide complete and legal documentation of all sub systems, licensed operating systems, licensed system software/firmware, licensed utility software and other licensed software. The Vendor shall also provide licensed software for all software/firmware whether developed by them or acquired from others
 - iii. In case the Vendor is providing software/firmware which is not its proprietary software then the Vendor must submit evidence in the form of agreement he has entered into with the software/firmware vendor which includes support from the software/firmware vendor for the proposed software for the entire period required by SBI Payments



33. Services:

- 33.1. All professional services necessary to successfully implement the proposed 'product/solution/services' will be part of the RFP/contract. These services include, but are not limited to, Project Management, Training, Deployment methodologies etc.
- 33.2. The Bidder should also submit as part of technical Bid an overview of Project Management approach of the proposed product.
- 33.3. Vendor should ensure that the quality of methodologies for delivering the services, adhere to quality standards/timelines stipulated thereof.
- 33.4. The bidder shall be willing to transfer skills to relevant personnel from the SBI Payments, by means of training and documentation.
- 33.5. The bidder shall provide and implement patches/ upgrades/ updates for products (Software/OS) as and when released by the Vendor/OEM or as per requirements of the SBI Payments. Bidder should bring to notice of the SBI Payments and its TSP(s) of all releases/ version changes.
- 33.6. Bidder shall obtain a written permission from SBI Payments before applying any of the patches/ upgrades/ updates. Bidder has to support older versions of the OS/firmware/Middleware etc in case SBI Payments chooses not to upgrade to latest version. In case patches are related to security/compliances, SBI Payments will be informed within 4 hours of releasing the patch.
- 33.7. Bidder shall provide maintenance support for Hardware/ Software/ Operating System/ Middleware over the entire period of contract/warranty period
- 33.8. All product updates, upgrades & patches shall be provided by the Bidder/ Vendor free of cost during warranty period.
- 33.9. Bidder shall provide legally valid firmware/software solution. The detailed information on license count and type of license should also be provided to SBI Payments.
- 33.10. The ownership of the customized software/firmware license and the hard-ware shall be that of SBI Payments from the date of delivery of the same to SBI Payments. In other words, wherever the ownership of the licens-



es/hardware is indicated, the name "SBI Payments" must appear to indicate that SBI Payments/Bank is the perpetual owner of the customized hardware/operating software/firmware, etc. associated with the hardware. Evidence in this regard must be submitted before the payment is released.

33.11. The Bidder shall keep SBI Payments explicitly informed the end of support dates on related products/hardware/firmware and should ensure support during warranty.

34. Warranty

- 34.1. All parts of items supplied would be covered under comprehensive warranty. If there is any gap between SBI Payments and OEM warranty then it will be the responsibility of vendor to fill up the gap.
- 34.2. Vendor should undertake to provide maintenance support to equipment and arrange for spare parts for sound box device during warranty period or any extended period.
- 34.3. Vendor should adhere to the warranty clause outlined in Annexure C of this RFP document.

35. Compliance with IS Security Policy:

The Vendor shall have to comply with SBI Payments IT & IS Security policy in key concern areas relevant to the RFP, details of which will be shared with the finally selected Bidder. Some of the key areas are as under:

- i. Responsibilities for data and application privacy and confidentiality
- ii. Responsibilities on system and software access control and administration
- iii. Custodial responsibilities for data, software, hardware and other assets of the SBI Payments being managed by or assigned to the Vendor
- iv. Physical Security of the facilities
- v. Physical and logical separation from other customers of the Vendor
- vi. Incident response and reporting procedures
- vii. Password Policy of the SBI Payments



- viii. Data Encryption/Protection requirements of the SBI Payments
- ix. In general, confidentiality, integrity and availability must be ensured

36. Penalty/SLA conditions:

As mentioned in **Annexure-L** of this RFP.

37. Right to Verification:

SBI Payments reserves the right to verify any or all of the statements made by the Bidder in the tender document and to inspect the Bidder's facility, if necessary, to establish to its satisfaction about the Bidder's capacity/capabilities to perform the job.

38. Purchase Price:

- 38.1. Total cost of product/solution (hardware equipment/ components/ software) with support (Warranty), service charge for change request would be the Total Cost of Ownership (TCO) and has to be quoted in commercial Bid.
- 38.2. Bidders should ensure that exchange rate fluctuations, changes in import duty/other taxes should not affect the rupee value of commercial Bid over the validity period defined in this RFP.
- 38.3. The order will be placed for total Cost of "Hardware, Software/Firmware/Services/Warranty. SBI Payments may also issue a separate order for AMC after expiry of the warranty period.
- 38.4. The applicable TDS will be deducted at the time of payment of invoices.
- 38.5. Terms of payment are given in Part-II of this RFP document.
- 38.6. Prices payable to the Vendor as stated in the Contract shall be firm and not subject to adjustment during the performance of the Contract, irrespective of reasons whatsoever, including exchange rate fluctuations, any upward revision in duties, charges, etc.
- 38.7. The Bidder will pass on to the SBI Payments, all fiscal benefits arising out of reductions, if any, in Government levies viz. sales tax, excise duty, custom duty, etc. or the benefit of discounts if any announced in respect of the cost of the items for which orders have been placed during that period.



- 38.8. SBI Payments reserves the right to re-negotiate the prices in the event of:
 - (a) Change in the international market prices of both the hardware and software.
 - (b) Purchase Order of bulk quantity provided by the SBI Payments.
 - (c) SBI Payments come to know that the same product/services are provided at the lower rates to the others in the market.
 - (d) Vendors informs SBI Payments of the reduction in the prices of the offered products/services.

39. Inspection and Quality Control Tests

- 39.1. SBI Payments reserves the right to carry out inspection by a team of SBI Payments officials or demand a demonstration of the software / product features on a representative model at Bidder's place.
- 39.2. The Inspection and Quality Control tests before evaluation, prior to shipment of goods and at the time of final acceptance would be as follows:
 - i. Inspection/Pre-shipment Acceptance Testing of Goods as per quality control formats including functional testing, burn-in tests and mains fluctuation tests at full load, facilities etc., as per the standards / specifications and may be done at factory site of the supplier before dispatch of goods, by SBI Payments Consultants / Testing Agency.
 - ii. The Vendor shall intimate SBI Payments before dispatching the goods to various locations/offices for conduct of pre-shipment testing. Successful conduct and conclusion of pre-dispatch inspection shall be the sole responsibility of the supplier.
 - iii. Provided that SBI Payments may, at its sole discretion, waive inspection of goods having regard to the value of the order and/or the nature of the goods and/or any other such basis as may be decided at the sole discretion of SBI Payments meriting waiver of such inspection of goods
 - iv. In the event of the product failing to pass the acceptance test, as per the specifications given, a period not exceeding two weeks will be given to rectify the defects and clear the acceptance test, failing which, SBI Payments reserves the right to cancel the Purchase Order.



- v. The inspection and quality control tests may also be conducted at the point of delivery and / or at the Goods' final destination. Reasonable facilities and assistance, including access to drawings and production data, shall be furnished to the inspectors, at no charge to SBI Payments. In case of failure by the vendor to provide necessary facility / equipment at his premises, all the cost of such inspection like travel, boarding, lodging & other incidental expenses of SBI Payments' representatives to be borne by the vendor.
- vi. Nothing stated herein above shall in any way release the supplier from any warranty or other obligations under this Contract.
- 39.3. SBI Payments' right to inspect, test and where necessary reject the products after the product installation at the destination shall in no way be limited or waived by reason of the products having previously being inspected, tested and passed by SBI Payments or its representative prior to the products installation from the place of origin by SBI Payments or its representative prior to the installation and commissioning.
- 39.4. SBI Payments' right to inspect, test and where necessary reject the products after the products arrival at the destination shall in no way be limited or waived by reason of the products having previously being inspected, tested and passed by SBI Payments or its representative prior to the products shipment from the place of origin by SBI Payments or its representative prior to the installation and commissioning.
- 39.5. Nothing stated hereinabove shall in any way release the Vendor from any warranty or other obligations under this contract

40. Right to Audit:

40.1. The Selected Bidder (Vendor) has to get itself annually audited by internal/ external empaneled Auditors appointed by the SBI Payments/SBI Payments/ inspecting official from the Reserve Bank of India or any regulatory authority, covering the risk parameters finalized by the SBI Payments// such auditors in the areas of products (IT hardware/ software) and services etc. provided to SBI Payments and the Vendor are required to submit such certification by such Auditors to the SBI Payments. The Vendor and or his / their outsourced agents / sub – contractors (if allowed by the SBI Payments/SBI Payments) shall facilitate the same. The SBI Payments can make an expert assessment on the efficiency and effectiveness of the security, control, risk



management, governance system and process created by the Vendor. The Vendor shall, whenever required by the Auditors, furnish all relevant information, records/data to them. All costs for such an audit shall be borne by the SBI Payments.

- 40.2. Where any deficiency has been observed during audit of the Vendor on the risk parameters finalized by the SBI Payments or in the certification submitted by the Auditors, the Vendor shall correct/resolve the same at the earliest at their cost and shall provide all necessary documents related to resolution thereof and the auditor shall further certify in respect of resolution of the deficiencies. The resolution provided by the Vendor shall require to be certified by the Auditors covering the respective risk parameters against which such deficiencies have been observed.
- 40.3. Vendor shall, whenever required by the SBI Payments, furnish all relevant information, records/data to such auditors and/or inspecting officials of the SBI Payments/SBI Payments/Reserve Bank of India and or any regulatory authority. SBI Payments / reserves the right to call and/or retain for any relevant material information /reports including audit or review reports undertaken by the Vendor (e.g., financial, internal control and security reviews) and findings made on Selected Bidder in conjunction with the services provided to the SBI Payments.

41. Subcontracting:

- 41.1. Vendor shall perform its obligations under this Tender as an independent contractor and may engage subcontractors to perform any of the Deliverables or Services with prior permission from SBI Payments before contracting any work to subcontractors. SBI Payments at its own discretion may permit or deny the same.
- 41.2. In case subcontracting is permitted by the SBI Payments, the contracting vendor will be responsible for all the services provided to the SBI Payments regardless of which entity is conducting the operations. The contracting vendor is also responsible for ensuring that the sub-contractor complies with all security requirements of the contract and the SBI Payments can obtain independent audit report for the same. In such a case, the Bidder shall provide subcontracting details to the SBI Payments and if required, SBI Payments may evaluate the same.



42.Insurance:

- 42.1. Transit insurance shall be for an amount equal to 110 percent of the value of the Products from on "All Risks" basis, valid till delivery of product on the SBI Payments/TSPs location/warehouse.
- 42.2. Should any loss or damage occur, the Vendor shall initiate and pursue claim till settlement and Promptly make arrangements for repair and / or replacement of any damaged item to the satisfaction of the SBI Payments, irrespective of settlement of claim by the underwriters.

43. Validity of Agreement:

- 43.1. The Empanelment Agreement will be valid for the period of **3 years**;
- 43.2. Furthermore, SBI Payments reserves the right to extend the empanelment period for further 12 months on same terms & conditions.
- 43.3. The SLA / Rate contract shall be valid of 01 year or issuance of Purchase Order for total awarded quantity from the date finalization of price bid discovered through Reverse Auction.
- 43.4. Terminal Management System support shall continue to be provided up to end of empanelment period (extended period if any) or end of supplied product warranty period whichever later.
- 43.5. SBI Payments reserve the right to terminate the agreement as per the terms of the RFP/Agreement.

44. Limitation of liability:

- 44.1. For breach of any obligation mentioned in this RFP, subject to obligations mentioned in this clause, in no event Vendor / service provider shall be liable for damages to SBI Payments arising under or in connection with this Agreement for an amount exceeding the total Cost of the Project. Vendor / service provider will ensure SBI Payments/Bank's data confidentiality and shall be responsible for liability arising in case of breach of any kind of security and/or leakage of confidential customer/Bank/SBI Payments' related information to the extent of loss so caused.
- 44.2. The limitations set forth herein shall not apply with respect to:



- i. Claims that are the subject of indemnification pursuant to IPR infringement,
- ii. Damage(s) occasioned by the gross negligence, fraud or willful misconduct of Vendor,
- iii. Damage(s) occasioned by Vendor for breach of Confidentiality Obligations, Reputational loss or damages thus sustained.
- iv. When a dispute is settled by the Court of Law in India.
- v. Regulatory or statutory fines imposed by a Government or Regulatory agency for non-compliance of statutory or regulatory guidelines applicable to the SBI Payments/SBI Payments, provided such guidelines were brought to the notice of Vendor and non-compliance is due to the Vendor.

45. Confidentiality:

- 45.1. Bidder acknowledges and agrees that all tangible and intangible information obtained, developed or disclosed including all documents, contract, purchase order to be issued, data papers and statements and trade secret of the SBI Payments relating to its business practices and their competitive position in the market place provided to the selected Bidder by the SBI Payments in connection with the performance of obligations of Bidder under the purchase order to be issued, in part or complete shall be considered to be confidential and proprietary information ("Confidential Information") and shall not be disclosed to any third party/published without the written approval of the SBI Payments.
- 45.2. The Confidential Information will be safe guarded and Bidder will take all the necessary action to protect it against misuse, loss, destruction, alterations or deletions thereof. In the event of a breach or threatened breach by Bidder of this section, monetary damages may not be an adequate remedy; therefore, SBI Payments shall be entitled to injunctive relief to restrain Bidder from any such breach, threatened or actual.
- 45.3. Any document, other than the Contract itself, shall remain the property of the SBI Payments and shall be returned (in all copies) to the SBI Payments on completion of the Vendor's performance under the Contract, if so, required by the SBI Payments.



46. Delay in Vendor's Performance:

- 46.1. Delivery of the Products/Solution and performance of Services shall be made by the Vendor within the timelines prescribed in part II of this document.
- 46.2. If at any time during performance of the Contract, the Vendor should encounter conditions impeding timely delivery of the Products and performance of Services, the Vendor shall promptly notify SBI Payments in writing of the fact of the delay, it's likely duration and cause(s). As soon as practicable after receipt of the Vendor's notice, SBI Payments shall evaluate the situation and may, at its discretion, extend the Vendors' time for performance, in which case, the extension shall be ratified by the parties by amendment of the Contract.
- 46.3. Any delay in performing the obligation/ defect in performance by the supplier may result in imposition of penalty, liquidated damages, invocation of Performance Bank Guarantee and/or termination of contract (as laid down elsewhere in this RFP document).

47. Vendor's obligations:

- 47.1. The Vendor is responsible for and obliged to conduct all contracted activities in accordance with the contract using state-of-the-art methods and economic principles and exercising all means available to achieve the performance specified in the Contract.
- 47.2. The vendor will be responsible for arranging and procuring all relevant permissions / Road Permits etc. for transportation of the equipment to the location where installation is to be done. SBI Payments would only provide necessary letters for enabling procurement of the same
- 47.3. The Vendor is obliged to work closely with SBI Payments's staff, act within its own authority and abide by directives issued by the SBI Payments/SBI Payments from time to time and complete implementation activities.
- 47.4. The Vendor will abide by the job safety measures prevalent in India and will free the SBI Payments from all demands or responsibilities arising from accidents or loss of life, the cause of which is the Vendor's negligence. The Vendor will pay all indemnities arising from such incidents and will not hold the SBI Payments responsible or obligated.



- 47.5. The Vendor is responsible for managing the activities of its personnel or sub-contracted personnel (where permitted) and will hold itself responsible for any misdemeanors.
- 47.6. Vendor shall provide necessary training from the OEM to the designated SBI Payments officials and / or its partners officials on the configuration, operation/ functionalities, maintenance, support & administration for software/ hardware and components, installation, troubleshooting processes of the proposed solution.
- 47.7. The Vendor shall treat as confidential all data and information about SBI Payments, obtained in the process of executing its responsibilities, in strict confidence and will not reveal such information to any other party without prior written approval of the SBI Payments/ SBI Payments as explained under 'Non-Disclosure Agreement' in **Annexure N** of this document.
- 47.8. The Vendor shall report the incidents, including cyber incidents and those resulting in disruption of service and data loss/ leakage immediately but not later than one hour of detection.
- 47.9. The Vendor agrees to comply with the obligations arising out of the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023 and its rules. Any processing of Personal Data by the Vendors in the performance of this Agreement shall be in compliance with the above Act thereafter. The Vendor shall also procure that any sub-contractor (if allowed) engaged by it shall act in compliance with the above Act, to the extent applicable. The Vendor understands and agrees that this agreement may have to be modified in a time bound manner to ensure that the provisions contained herein are in compliance with the above Act.

48. Technical Documentation:

48.1. The Vendor shall deliver the following documents to the SBI Payments/Bank for every firmware/software including third party software before software/ service become operational, which includes, user manuals, installation manuals, operation manuals, design documents, process documents, technical manuals, functional specification, software requirement specification, on-line tutorials/ CBTs, system configuration documents, system/database administrative documents, debugging/diagnostics documents, test procedures etc.



- 48.2. The vendor shall also provide documents related to Review Records/ Test Bug Reports/ Root Cause Analysis Report, list of all Product components, list of all dependent/external modules and list of all documents relating to traceability of the Product as and when applicable or required.
- 48.3. The Vendor should also provide the MIS reports as per requirements of the SBI Payments. Any level/ version changes and/or clarification or corrections or modifications in the above-mentioned documentation should be supplied by the Vendor to the SBI Payments/Bank, free of cost in timely manner. The vendor shall develop customized documentation as per SBI Payments/Bank's requirement, if desired by SBI Payments.

49. Patent Rights/Intellectual Property Rights:

- 49.1. For any licensed software/firmware used by the finally selected Vendors for performing services, the Vendor shall have the right as well as the right to license for the outsourced services. The vendor shall, if applicable, furnish a photocopy of the Agreement with their Principals/OEM in respect of 'Product' and services offered. Any license or IPR violation on the part of Vendor should not put the SBI Payments/ at risk. The SBI Payments reserves the right to audit the license usage of the Vendor.
- 49.2. The Vendor shall, at its own expenses without any limitation, defend and indemnify the SBI Payments/ against all third party claims or infringements of intellectual Property Rights including patent, trademark, copyright, trade secret or industrial design rights arising from use of the products or any part thereof in India or abroad. In case of violation/ infringement of patent/ trademark/ copyright/ trade secret or industrial design, the supplier shall after due inspection and testing get the solution redesigned for the SBI Payments, at no extra cost.
- 49.3. The Vendor shall expeditiously extinguish any such claims and shall have full rights to defend itself there from. If the SBI Payments is required to pay compensation to a third party resulting from such infringement(s), the Vendor shall be fully responsible therefore, including all expenses and court and legal fees.
- 49.4. SBI Payments will give notice to the Vendor of any such claim without delay, provide reasonable assistance to the vendor in disposing of the claim, and shall at no time admit to any liability for or express any intent to settle the



claim.

50. Liquidated Damages:

If Vendor fails to deliver and perform any or all the Services within the stipulated time, schedule as specified in this RFP/Agreement, SBI Payments may, without prejudice to its other remedies under the RFP/Agreement, and unless otherwise extension of time is agreed upon without the application of liquidated damages, deduct from the Project Cost, as liquidated damages a sum equivalent to 0.5% of total Project Cost for delay of each week or part thereof maximum up to 5% of total Project Cost. Once the maximum deduction is reached, SBI Payments may consider termination of the Agreement.

51. Conflict of Interest:

Bidder shall not have a conflict of interest (the "Conflict of Interest") that affects the bidding process. Any Bidder found to have a Conflict of Interest shall be disqualified. In the event of disqualification, the SBI Payments shall be entitled to forfeit and appropriate the Bid Security and/or Performance Security (Performance Bank Guarantee), as the case may be, as mutually agreed upon genuine estimated loss and damage likely to be suffered and incurred by SBI Payments and not by way of penalty for, inter alia, the time, cost and effort of the SBI Payments, including consideration of such Bidder's proposal (the "Damages"), without prejudice to any other right or remedy that may be available to the SBI Payments under the bidding documents and/ or the Agreement or otherwise. Without limiting the generality of the above, a Bidder shall be deemed to have a Conflict of Interest affecting the bidding process, if:

it. The Bidder, its Member or Associate (or any constituent thereof) and any other Bidder, its Member or any Associate thereof (or any constituent thereof) have common controlling shareholders or other ownership interest; provided that this disqualification shall not apply in cases where the direct or indirect shareholding of a Bidder, its Member or an Associate thereof (or any shareholder thereof having a shareholding of more than 5% (five per cent) of the paid up and subscribed share capital of such Bidder, Member or Associate, as the case may be) in the other Bidder, its Member or Associate, has less than 5% (five per cent) of the subscribed and paid up equity share capital thereof; provided further that this disqualification shall not apply to any ownership by SBI Payments, insurance company, pension fund or a public financial institution referred to in section 4A of the Companies Act, 1956. For



the purposes of this Clause, indirect shareholding held through one or more intermediate persons shall be computed as follows:

- a) Where any intermediary is controlled by a person through management control or otherwise, the entire shareholding held by such controlled intermediary in any other person (the "Subject Person") shall be taken into account for computing the shareholding of such controlling person in the Subject Person; and
- b) Subject always to sub-clause (a) above, where a person does not exercise control over an intermediary, which has shareholding in the Subject Person, the computation of indirect shareholding of such person in the Subject Person shall be undertaken on a proportionate basis; provided, however, that no such shareholding shall be reckoned under this subclause if the shareholding of such person in the intermediary is less than 26% of the subscribed and paid up equity shareholding of such intermediary; or
- ii. a constituent of such Bidder is also a constituent of another Bidder; or
- iii. such Bidder, its Member or any Associate thereof receives or has received any direct or indirect subsidy, grant, concessional loan or subordinated debt from any other Bidder, its Member or Associate, or has provided any such subsidy, grant, concessional loan or subordinated debt to any other Bidder, its Member or any Associate thereof; or
- iv. such Bidder has the same legal representative for purposes of this Bid as any other Bidder; or
- v. such Bidder, or any Associate thereof, has a relationship with another Bidder, or any Associate thereof, directly or through common third party/ parties, that puts either or both of them in a position to have access to each other's information about, or to influence the Bid of either or each other; or
- vi. such Bidder or any of its affiliates thereof has participated as a consultant to the SBI Payments in the preparation of any documents, design or technical specifications of the Project.
- vii. Bidder shall not receive any remuneration in connection with the assignment except as provided in the Contract.



52. Fraud & Corrupt Practices:

- 52.1. The Bidder and their respective officers, employees, agents and advisers shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the bidding process. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, the SBI Payments shall reject an Application without being liable in any manner whatsoever to the Bidder if it determines that the Bidder has, directly or indirectly or through an agent, engaged in corrupt/fraudulent/coercive/undesirable or restrictive practices in the bidding process.
- 52.2. Without prejudice to the rights of SBI Payments under Clause 48(i) hereinabove, if a Bidder is found by the SBI Payments to have directly or indirectly or through an agent, engaged or indulged in any corrupt/fraudulent/coercive/undesirable or restrictive practices during the bidding process, such Bidder shall not be eligible to participate in any EOI/RFP issued by the SBI Payments during a period of 2 (two) years from the date if such Bidder is found by the SBI Payments to have directly or indirectly or through an agent, engaged or indulged in any corrupt/ fraudulent/
- 52.3. For the purposes of this Clause, the following terms shall have the meaning hereinafter, respectively assigned to them:
 - "corrupt practice" means (48.1) the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the actions of any person connected with the bidding process (for avoidance of doubt, offering of employment to or employing or engaging in any manner whatsoever, directly or indirectly, any official of SBI Payments who is or has been associated in any manner, directly or indirectly with the bidding process or the Letter of Authority or has dealt with matters concerning the Concession Agreement or arising there from, before or after the execution thereof, at any time prior to the expiry of one year from the date such official resigns or retires from or otherwise ceases to be in the service of the SBI Payments, shall be deemed to constitute influencing the actions of a person connected with the bidding process); or (ii) engaging in any manner whatsoever, whether during the bidding process or after the issue of the Letter of Authority or after the execution of the Agreement, as the case may be, any person in respect of any matter relating to the Project or the Letter of Authority or the Agreement, who at any time has been or is a legal, financial or technical adviser of the SBI Payments in relation to any matter concerning the Project;



- ii. "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation or omission of facts or suppression of facts or disclosure of incomplete facts, in order to influence the bidding process
- iii. "Coercive practice" means impairing or harming or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any person or property to influence any person's participation or action in the bidding process;
- iv. "Undesirable practice" means (a) establishing contact with any person connected with or employed or engaged by SBI Payments with the objective of canvassing, lobbying or in any manner influencing or attempting to influence the bidding process; or (b) having a Conflict of Interest; and
- v. "Restrictive practice" means forming a cartel or arriving at any understanding or arrangement among Bidders with the objective of restricting or manipulating a full and fair competition in the Bidding Process.

53. Termination for Default:

- 53.1. SBI Payments, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of Contract, by a written notice of not less than 30 (thirty) days sent to the Vendor, may terminate the Contract in whole or in part:
 - i. If the Vendor fails to deliver any or all of the Products and Services within the period(s) specified in the Contract, or within any extension thereof granted by the SBI Payments; or
 - ii. If the Vendor fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the contract; or
 - iii. Laxity in adherence to standards laid down by SBI Payments or
 - iv. Discrepancies/deviations in the agreed processes and/or products; or
 - v. Violations of terms and conditions stipulated in this RFP; or
 - vi. Non-performance of the product/services as required in the RFP.
- 53.2. In the event the SBI Payments terminates the Contract in whole or in part for the breaches attributable to the Vendor, the SBI Payments/ may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, Products and Services similar to those undelivered, and the Vendor shall be liable to the SBI Payments for any increase in cost for such similar Products and/or Ser-



- vices. However, the Vendor shall continue performance of the Contract to the extent not terminated.
- 53.3. If the contract is terminated under any termination clause, the Vendor shall handover all documents/ executable/ SBI Payments/SBI Payments's data or any other relevant information to the SBI Payments/SBI Payments in timely manner and in proper format as per scope of this RFP and shall also support the orderly transition to another Vendor or to the SBI Payments.
- 53.4. During the transition, the Vendor shall also support the SBI Payments on technical queries/support on process implementation or in case of software provision for future upgrades.
- 53.5. SBI Payments' right to terminate the Contract will be in addition to the penalties /liquidated damages and other actions as deemed fit.

54. Force Majeure:

- 54.1. Notwithstanding the provisions of terms and conditions contained in this RFP, the Vendor shall not be liable for forfeiture of its performance security, liquidated damages, or termination for default, if any, and to the extent that the delay in performance or other failure to perform its obligations under the Contract is the result of an event of Force Majeure.
- 54.2. For the purposes of this clause, 'Force Majeure' means and includes wars, insurrections, revolution, civil disturbance, riots, terrorist acts, public strikes, hartal, bundh, fires, floods, epidemic, quarantine restrictions, freight embargoes, declared general strikes in relevant industries, Vis Major Act of Government, impeding reasonable performance of the Vendor and / or Sub-Contractor but does not include any foreseeable events, commercial considerations or those involving fault or negligence on the part of the party claiming Force Majeure.
- 54.3. If a Force Majeure situation arises, the Vendor shall promptly notify the SBI Payments in writing of such condition and the cause thereof. Unless otherwise directed by the SBI Payments in writing, the Vendor shall continue to perform its obligations under the Contract as far as is reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event.



55. Termination for Insolvency:

SBI Payments may, at any time, terminate the Contract by giving written notice to the Vendor, if the Vendor becomes Bankrupt or insolvent or any application for Bankruptcy, insolvency or winding up has been filed against it by any person. In this event, termination will be without compensation to the Vendor, provided that such termination will not prejudice or affect any right of action or remedy, which has accrued or will accrue thereafter to the SBI Payments.

56. Termination for Convenience:

SBI Payments, by written notice of not less than 90 (ninety) days sent to the Vendor, may terminate the Contract, in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that termination is for the SBI Payments convenience, the extent to which performance of the Vendor under the Contract is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.

In the event of termination of the Agreement for the SBI Payments' convenience, Vendor shall be entitled to receive payment for the Services rendered (delivered) up to the effective date of termination.

57. Disputes / Arbitration [applicable in case of successful Bidder only]:

- 57.1. All disputes or differences whatsoever arising between the parties out of or in connection with this contract or in discharge of any obligation arising out of the Contract (whether during the progress of work or after completion of such work and whether before or after the termination of this contract, abandonment or breach of this contract), shall be settled amicably. If however, the parties are not able to solve them amicably, either party (SBI Payments or Vendor), give written notice to other party clearly setting out there in specific dispute(s) and/or difference(s) and shall be referred to a sole arbitrator mutually agreed upon, and the award made in pursuance thereof shall be binding on the parties. In the absence of consensus about the single arbitrator, the dispute may be referred to joint arbitrator; one to be nominated by each party and the said arbitrators shall nominate a presiding arbitrator, before commencing the arbitration proceedings. The arbitration shall be settled in accordance with the applicable Indian Laws. Any appeal will be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of courts at Mumbai.
- 57.2. The Vendor shall continue work under the Contract during the arbitration proceedings unless otherwise directed by SBI Payments or unless the mat-



ter is such that the work cannot possibly be continued until the decision of the arbitrator is obtained.

- 57.3. Arbitration proceeding shall be held at Mumbai, India, and the language of the arbitration proceedings and that of all documents and communications between the parties shall be in English.
- 57.4. In case of any change in applicable laws that has an effect on the terms of this Agreement, the Parties agree that the Agreement may be reviewed, and if deemed necessary by the Parties, make necessary amendments to the Agreement by mutual agreement in good faith, in case of disagreement obligations mentioned in this clause shall be observed.

58. Governing Language:

The governing language shall be English.

59. Applicable Law:

The Contract shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Union of India and shall be subjected to the exclusive jurisdiction of courts at Mumbai.

60. Taxes and Duties:

- 60.1. The Vendor shall be liable to pay all corporate taxes and income tax that shall be levied according to the laws and regulations applicable from time to time in India and the price Bid by the Vendor shall include all such taxes in the contract price.
- 60.2. Prices quoted should be exclusive of all Central / State Government taxes/duties and levies but inclusive of Custom duty as also cost of incidental services such as transportation, road permits, insurance etc. The quoted prices and taxes/duties and statutory levies such as GST, Service tax, VAT/ Sales tax, Excise duty, Custom duty, Octroi, etc. should be specified in the separate sheet.
- 60.3. Custom duty as also cost of incidental services such as transportation, road permits, insurance etc. in connection with delivery of products at site including any incidental services and commissioning, if any, which may be levied, shall be borne by the Vendor and SBI Payments shall not be liable for the same. Only specified taxes/ levies and duties in the Annexure-F will be payable by SBI Payments on actuals upon production of original receipt wher-



ever required. If any specified taxes/ levies and duties in Annexure-F are replaced by the new legislation of Government, same shall be borne by SBI Payments. SBI Payments shall not be liable for payment of those Central / State Government taxes, levies, duties or any tax/ duties imposed by local bodies/ authorities, which are not specified by the Bidder in Annexure-F.

- 60.4. Prices payable to the Vendor as stated in the Contract shall be firm and not subject to adjustment during performance of the Contract, irrespective of reasons whatsoever, including exchange rate fluctuations, any upward revision in Custom duty. The Bidder will pass on to SBI Payments, all fiscal benefits arising out of reductions, if any, in Government levies viz. custom duty or the benefit of discounts if any announced in respect of the cost of the items for which orders have been placed during that period.
- 60.5. Income / Corporate Taxes in India: The Bidder shall be liable to pay all corporate taxes and income tax that shall be levied according to the laws and regulations applicable from time to time in India and the price Bid by the Bidder shall include all such taxes in the contract price.
- 60.6. All expenses, stamp duty and other charges/ expenses in connection with the execution of the Agreement as a result of this RFP process shall be borne by the Vendor.
- 60.7. Parties shall fulfil all their respective compliance requirements under the GST law. This shall include (but not be limited to):
 - i. SBI Payments shall pay GST amount after verifying the details of invoice on GSTR 2B on GSTN portal.
 - ii. In case any credit, refund or other benefit is denied or delayed to the SBI Payments/Bank due to any non-compliance of GST Laws by the vendor including but not limited to, failure to upload the details of invoice or any other details of the supply of goods or services, as the case may be, as required under GST Law on the appropriate government's goods and services tax network portal, the failure to pay applicable GST to the Government or due to non-furnishing or furnishing of incorrect or incomplete documents by the party, vendor would reimburse the loss to the SBI Payments/Bank including, but not limited to, any tax loss or denial of credit, interest and penalty and reasonable fee for contesting the demand. The amount payable under this clause shall survive irrespective of termination of agreement if the demand



pertains to the agreement period.

- iii. In case of any tax demand or denial of ITC or refund or any other benefit by the GST authorities, both the parties may mutually decide whether to contest the matter. In case, it is decided to contest the matter, the vendor is required to deposit the disputed demand including interest and penalty proposed with the other party without waiting for the outcome of the legal proceeding. In case the matter is finally decided in favour of the other party, the other party is required to refund the amount received from the defaulting party without any interest.
- 60.8. All expenses, stamp duty and other charges/ expenses in connection with the execution of the Agreement as a result of this RFP process shall be borne by Vendor. The Agreement/ Contract would be stamped as per Maharashtra Stamp Act, 1958 and any amendment thereto.

61. Tax deduction at Source:

- 61.1. Wherever the laws and regulations require deduction of such taxes at the source of payment, SBI Payments shall effect such deductions from the payment due to the Vendor. The remittance of amounts so deducted and issuance of certificate for such deductions shall be made by SBI Payments as per the laws and regulations for the time being in force. Nothing in the Contract shall relieve the Vendor from his responsibility to pay any tax that may be levied in India on income and profits made by the Vendor in respect of this contract.
- 61.2. The Vendor's staff, personnel and labour will be liable to pay personal income taxes in India in respect of such of their salaries and wages as are chargeable under the laws and regulations for the time being in force, and the Vendor shall perform such duties in regard to such deductions thereof as may be imposed on him by such laws and regulations.
- 61.3. SBI Payments will deduct TDS at applicable rate while making payment under GST Act 2017 and Income Tax Act 1961.

62. Right to use defective product:

If after delivery, acceptance and installation and within the warranty period, the operation or use of the product is found to be unsatisfactory, SBI Payments shall have the right to continue to operate or use such product until rectification of defects, er-

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rors or omissions by partial or complete replacement is made without interfering with SBI Payments' operation and without any additional cost on SBI Payments on account of such rectification, repair, replacement which may also include transportation cost.

63. Tender Fee:

Non-refundable Tender Fee should be furnished by the Bidders in the form of Demand Draft/ Bankers' Cheque as mentioned in part II. It should be enclosed with Technical Bid. The Bids without tender fee will not be considered valid.

64. Notices:

SCOPE OF WORK

1. General Scope of Work

- **1.2** SBI Payments desires to empanel vendors for Supply of Sound Box devices (QR) for the three years under Capex model.
- 1.3 Once the vendors are empaneled, the commercial bids will be called every year or as and when SBI Payments desires from the empaneled vendors and a Rate Contract model shall be adopted every year (during the empaneled period) for a period of 1 year based on the yearly estimates or business requirement.
- **1.4** The scope of work is to provide Sound Box devices which will be integrated with the SBI Payments existing UPI infrastructure for receiving QR based transactions and voice notification on the Sound Box at the merchant location.
- 1.5 The SBI Payments envisages to procure 10,00,000 (Ten Lakh) Sound Boxes over a period of 36 months. This estimate have been made on the basis of market feedback. PENALTIES AND SLA TERMS

The purpose of this Service Level Agreement (hereinafter referred to as SLA) is to clearly define the levels of service which shall be expected from the selected Vendor during the implementation and its subsequent support on the Terminal Management System for the project period. The severity would be as follows. It will SBI Payments's discretion to assign the appropriate severity parameter to the incident

High: The identified issue has a material business impact (Show Stopper) and needs to be resolved immediately. This level would typically correspond to issues that result into disruption of Platform services to SBI Payments. It is expected that the Bidder provides an immediate platform/ work around for "Show Stopper" issues so that SBI Payments can continue to function normally and then register the issue on priority by conducting a "Root Cause Analysis".

Medium: The identified issue has a significant business impact and needs to be taken up on top priority. This level would typically correspond to issues that result into disruption of one or more critical services to all the SBI Payments, Regulated entity offices and external institutions having an access.

Low: The incidents would be termed as low, which does not have any significant impact on the business or functionality.

The "Infrastructure Availability" metric for the proposed solution with an Infrastructure Availability Target **SLA of 99.99%** will be calculated as per below formula:

Total Solution Uptime - Total Qualifying Outage Time Total Solution Uptime X 100

For the purpose of Infrastructure Availability, Critical or High only severity Incidents will be considered. It will SBI Payments's discretion to assign the appropriate severity parameter to the incident. For any non-performance of SLA, penalties will be levied as per calculation below. The SLA performance measurement shall be tracked and reported every month, referred to as Reporting Period. However, the penalty calculation for not being able to fulfil SLA will be aligned with quarterly invoicing period, referred to as Measurement Period.

- The response time for all Types of Help Desk services incidents shall depend on the level on severity. There should be an initial response on a critical incident within 15 mins of incident booking, 30 mins of high severity ticket.

- 1.2.5 The Schedules, Annexures and Appendices to this Agreement shall form part of this Agreement.
- 1.2.6 A reference to any documents or agreements (and, where applicable, any of their respective provisions) means those documents or agreements as amended, supplemented or replaced from time to time provided they are amended, supplemented or replaced in the manner envisaged in the relevant documents or agreements.

- 1.2.7 The terms not defined in this Agreement shall be given the same meaning as given to them in the RFP. If no such meaning is given technical words shall be understood in technical sense in accordance with the industry practices

 - 4.1.2 The person(s) signing this agreement on behalf of the Parties have the necessary authority and approval for execution of this document and to bind his/their respective organization for due performance as set out in this Agreement. It has all necessary statutory and regula-

tory permissions, approvals and permits for the running and operation of its business.

- 4.1.3 It has full right, title and interest in and to all software, copyrights, trade names, trademarks, service marks, logos symbols and other proprietary marks (collectively 'IPR') (including appropriate limited right of use of those owned by any of its Vendors, affiliates or subcontractors) which it provides to the other Party, for use related to the services to be provided under this Agreement.
- 4.1.4 It will provide such cooperation as the other Party reasonably requests in order to give full effect to the provisions of this Agreement.
- 4.1.5 The execution and performance of this Agreement by either of the Parties does not and shall not violate any provision of any of the existing Agreement with any of the party and any other third party.
- 4.2 Additional Representation and Warranties by Vendor
 - 4.2.1 Vendor shall perform the Services and carry out its obligations under the Agreement with due diligence, efficiency and economy, in accordance with generally accepted techniques and practices used in the industry and with professional standards recognized by international professional bodies and shall observe sound management practices. It shall employ appropriate advanced technology and safe and effective equipment, machinery, material and methods.
 - 4.2.2 Vendor has the requisite technical and other competence, sufficient, suitable, qualified and experienced manpower/personnel and expertise in providing the Services to the SBI Payments.
 - 4.2.3 Vendor has valid and subsisting rights to all data, modules, components, designs, utilities, subsets, objects, programme listings, tools, models, methodologies, programs, systems analysis frameworks, leading practices, and specifications sought to be used by it in relation to the provision of the Services.
 - 4.2.4 Vendor warrants that to the best of its knowledge, Services and Deliverables provided by Vendor to the SBI Payments do not violate or infringe any patent, copyright, trademarks, trade secrets or other Intellectual Property Rights of any third party.
 - 4.2.5 Vendor shall duly intimate to the SBI Payments immediately, the changes, if any in the constitution of Vendor.
 - 4.2.6 The services and products provided by Vendor / service provider to SBI Payments do not violate or infringe any patent, copyright, trademarks, trade secrets or other intellectual property rights of any third party.

- 4.2.11 Warranty for Sound Box devices (QR): Vendor / Service Provider shall ensure that a comprehensive warranty shall be provided for the complete Sound Box devices (QR) including TMS support services as and when necessary, will be 24 months from the date of activation and first successful transaction.
- 4.2.12 Warranty for the System software/off-the -shelf Software will be provided to SBI Payments as per the general conditions of seal of such software.

Vendor / service provider will provide support from Operating Systems and other preinstalled software components during the warranty period of the Sound Box devices (QR) on which these software and operating system will be installed. Vendor / service provider shall repair or resolve or replace damage/Manufacturing defects/defective solution/ bugs including all software / licenses at its own cost including cost of transport, man-days.

5 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SBI PAYMENTS

- 5.1 SBI Payments shall designate a competent employee or employees, preferably within senior management, to be responsible for the completion of the Services contemplated under this Agreement and the supervision of the implementation of the Project Plan ("Nodal Officer").
- 5.2 The Nodal Officer shall assist Vendor in coordinating meetings/workshops with the relevant Heads of Departments and escalate issues/delays to the appropriate senior management and such Project Representative shall be Vendor's primary point of contact for the purposes of this Agreement. All communications to Vendor shall be made solely by the Nodal Officer, on behalf of the SBI Payments.
- 5.3 SBI Payments shall actively participate in providing required inputs and assessments required by the Vendor / Service Provider in providing the Services in terms of this Agreement and the implementation of the Project Plan and validate and provide its acceptance for all Reports on a timely basis, if such Reports are in a form and manner that is acceptable to the SBI Payments.
- 5.4 Vendor's / Service Provider's products and software contain proprietary electronics, software and technical information of Vendor / service provider or its licensor and that ownership of all patents, copyrights, mask work rights, trademarks, trade names and other intellectual property rights relating to or residing in the products and software shall remain with Vendor / service provider or its licensor till transfer of rights under BOT.
- 5.5 If SBI Payments shares the software with their Vendor / service provider for the purpose of testing the software with Vendor / service



provider Products, software and services, such sharing shall be under obligations of confidentiality and in accordance with this standard license.

6 RESPONSIBILITIES OF VENDOR

6.1 The responsibility of Vendor / service provider is as per the scope of work as provided in Clause 3, the Specifications provided in Annexure III and other

7. CONFIDENTIALITY

- 7.1 For the purpose of this Agreement, Confidential Information shall mean (i) information of all kinds, whether oral, written or otherwise recorded or in electronic form including, without limitation, any analyses, compilations, forecasts, data, studies or other documents including proposals, financial and accounting data, business and marketing plans, customer and supplier lists and related information, regarding the past, current or future affairs, business, plans or operations of a Party to which the other Party will have access, (ii) the existence of the contemplated terms and the fact that discussions or negotiations are taking place or have taken place between the Parties concerning the contemplated terms, (iii) any and all information regarding the contemplated terms and any agreements that may be entered into in relation thereto, (iv) any customer details or other data received by a Party from the other Party or its customer(s) or otherwise shared between the Parties in connection with the Service and (v) Deliverables/Work Product.
- 7.2 In consideration of each Party providing the other Party or its' representatives with the Confidential Information, the Parties agree as follows:
 - 7.2.1 Each Party shall keep confidential and shall not, directly or indirectly, disclose, except as provided in sub-clauses below, in any manner whatsoever, in whole or in part, the Confidential Information without the other Party's prior written consent.
 - 7.2.2 Each Party shall hold the Confidential Information in confidence and shall exercise all reasonable diligence in ensuring that the

Confidential Information is not disclosed to third parties and will refrain from using the Confidential Information for any purpose whatsoever other than for the purposes of this Agreement or for the purpose for which such information is supplied.

- 7.2.3 Notwithstanding the above, each Party may reveal the Confidential Information to those of its representatives, those of its' holding company and those of its subsidiaries who are involved in the negotiation or evaluation of the Project, and shall procure and ensure that each of them complies with the obligation to keep the Confidential Information secret, private and confidential and strictly observes the terms of this Agreement.
- 7.2.4 The confidentiality obligation shall not apply to such portions of the Confidential Information (other than the Customer details/ data of SBI Payments) which one of the Parties can demonstrate (i) are or become generally available to the public other than as a result of any breach of this Agreement, (ii) were in its possession on a non-confidential basis prior to the date hereof or (iii) have been rightfully received from a third party after the date hereof without restriction on disclosure and without breach of this Agreement, said third party being under no obligation of confidentiality to the other Party with respect to such Confidential Information.
- 7.2.5 In the event that a Party becomes legally compelled pursuant to any statutory or regulatory provision, court or arbitral decision, governmental order, or stock exchange requirements to disclose any of the Confidential Information, the compelled Party, as far as possible will provide the other Party with prompt written notice. In any case, the compelled Party will furnish only that portion of the Confidential Information which is legally required and will exercise all reasonable efforts to obtain reliable assurance that confidential treatment will be accorded to the Confidential Information.

- 7.2.6 In the event of termination or expiry of this Agreement, each Party shall either (i) promptly destroy all copies of the written (including information in electronic form) Confidential Information in its possession or that of its representatives; or (ii) promptly deliver to the other Party at its own expense all copies of the written Confidential Information in its possession or that of its representatives, provided, however, that (i) no notes, memoranda, analyses, studies or other documents prepared by it or its advisers in connection with the Services shall be returned or destroyed, but they shall be disposed in accordance with any specific directions in this Agreement or held and kept confidential, and that (ii) each Party shall be permitted to retain one copy of the Confidential Information for the purposes of dispute resolution, compliance with regulatory agency or authority and internal compliance procedures, provided such copies being held and kept confidential.
- 7.2.7 By furnishing the Confidential Information, no Party makes an express or implied representation or warranty as to the accuracy or completeness of the Confidential Information that it has disclosed and each Party expressly disclaims any liability that may be based on the Confidential Information, errors therein or omissions there from, save in the case of fraud or willful default.
- 7.3 Vendor / Service Provider shall not, without SBI Payments prior written consent, disclose the Agreement, or any provision thereof, or any specification, plan, drawing, pattern, sample or information furnished by or on behalf of SBI Payments in connection therewith, to any person other than a person employed by Vendor / service provider in the Performance of the Contract. Disclosure to any such employed person shall be made in confidence and shall extend only so far, as may be necessary to purposes of such performance.
- 7.4 Vendor / Service Provider shall not, without SBI Payments prior written



consent, make use of any document or information received from SBI Payments except for purposes of performing the services and obligations under this Agreement

- 7.5 Any document received from SBI Payments shall remain the property of SBI Payments and shall be returned (in all copies) to SBI Payments on completion of Vendor / service provider's performance under the Agreement.
- 7.6 The obligations set out in this Article shall continue even after the termination/ expiry of this Agreement. Confidentiality obligations of Vendor / service provider in respect of any customer data/ details of SBI Payments shall be absolute, unconditional and without any time limit, irrespective of the expiry/ termination of the Agreement.
- 7.7 Vendor / service provider agrees to indemnify and hereby keeps SBI Payments indemnified against all actions, claims, loss, damages, Costs, Charges, expenses (including Attorney / Advocate fees and legal expenses) which SBI Payments may suffer or incur on account of breach of confidentiality obligations as per this Agreement by Vendor / service provider or its employees, agents, representatives, Sub-contractors. Vendor / service provider further agrees to make good the loss suffered by SBI Payments upon first demand by SBI Payments which shall be final, conclusive and binding on Vendor / service provider.

8 RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

- 8.1 It is specifically agreed that Vendor shall act as independent Vendor and shall not be deemed to be the Agent of the SBI Payments except in respect of the transactions/services which give rise to Principal Agent relationship by express agreement between the Parties.
- 8.2 Neither Vendor nor its employees, agents, representatives, Sub- Contractors shall hold out or represent as agents of the SBI Payments.



- 8.3 None of the employees, representatives or agents of Vendor shall be entitled to claim permanent absorption or any other claim or benefit against the SBI Payments.
- 8.4 This Agreement shall not be construed as joint venture. Each Party shall be responsible for all its obligations towards its respective employees. No employee of any of the two Parties shall claim to be employee of other Party.
- 8.5 All the obligations towards the employee(s) of a Party on account of personal accidents while working in the premises of the other Party shall remain with the respective employer and not on the Party in whose premises the accident occurred unless such accidents occurred due to gross negligent act of the Party in whose premises the accident occurred.
- 8.6 For redressal of complaints of sexual harassment at workplace, Parties agree to comply with the policy framed by the SBI Payments (including any amendment thereto) in pursuant to the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013 including any amendment thereto.

9 SUB-CONTRACTING

- 9.1 Vendor shall perform its obligations under this Tender as an independent contractor and may engage subcontractors to perform any of the Deliverables or Services with prior permission from SBI Payments before contracting any work to subcontractors. SBI Payments at its own discretion may permit or deny the same.
- 9.2 In case subcontracting is permitted by the SBI Payments, the contracting vendor will be responsible for all the services provided to the SBI Payments regardless of which entity is conducting the operations. The contracting vendor is also responsible for ensuring that the sub-contractor complies with all security requirements of the contract and the SBI Payments can obtain independent audit report for the same. In such a case,

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the Bidder shall provide subcontracting details to the SBI Payments and if required, SBI Payments may evaluate the same.

- 9.3 Before engaging Sub-Contractor, Vendor / service provider shall carry out due diligence process on sub-contracting/ sub-contractor to the satisfaction of SBI Payments and SBI Payments should have access to such records.
- 9.4 In the event of sub-contracting Vendor / service provider shall ensure that suitable documents including confidentiality agreement are obtained from the sub-contractor and Vendor / service provider shall ensure that the secrecy and faith of SBI Payments data / processes is maintained
- 9.5 Notwithstanding approval of SBI Payments for sub-contracting, Vendor / service provider shall remain liable to SBI Payments for all acts/omissions of sub-contractors.
- 9.6 In respect of that part of the services where chain outsourcing and sub-contractors are permitted by SBI Payments, the sub-contractor should have same level of obligations as that of Vendor / service provider and Vendor / service provider agrees to obtain suitable documents in this regard from the sub-contractor.

10 PERFORMANCE GUARANTEE & PENALTY

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- 10.2 Performance of the obligations under the Agreement shall be made by Vendor in accordance with the time schedule specified in this Agreement.
- 10.3 Subject to clause 16 "Termination" of this Agreement, any unexcused delay by Vendor in the performance of its Contract obligations shall render this Agreement to be terminated.
- 10.4 If at any time during performance of the Contract, Vendor should encounter unexpected conditions impeding timely completion of the Services under the Agreement and performance of the services, Vendor shall promptly notify the SBI Payments in writing of the fact of the delay, its likely duration and its cause(s). As soon as practicable, after receipt of Vendor's notice, the SBI Payments shall evaluate the situation and may at its discretion extend Vendor's time for performance, in which case the extension shall be ratified by the Parties by amendment of the Agreement.
- 10.5 Vendor shall be liable to pay penalty at the rate mentioned in Annexure in respect of any delay beyond the permitted period in providing the Services.
- 10.6 No penalty shall be levied in case of delay(s) in deliverables or performance of the contract for the reasons solely and directly attributable to the SBI Payments. On reaching the maximum of penalties specified, the SBI Payments reserves the right to terminate the contract.

11 FORCE MAJEURE

- 11.1 Notwithstanding anything else contained in the Agreement, neither Party shall be liable for any delay in performing its obligations herein if and to the extent that such delay is the result of an event of Force Majeure.
- 11.2 For the purposes of this clause, 'Force Majeure' means and includes wars, insurrections, revolution, civil disturbance, riots, terrorist acts, public strikes, hartal, bundh, fires, floods, epidemic, quarantine restrictions,

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freight embargoes, declared general strikes in relevant industries, vis major acts of Government that affect a party's ability to conduct regular business but do not include any foreseeable events, commercial considerations or those involving fault or negligence on the part of the party claiming Force Majeure.

- 11.3 If a Force Majeure situation arises, Vendor / service provider shall promptly notify SBI Payments in writing of such conditions, the cause thereof and the likely duration of the delay. Unless otherwise directed by SBI Payments in writing, Vendor / service provider shall continue to perform its obligations under the Agreement as far as reasonably practical, and shall seek all reasonable alternative means for performance not prevented by the Force Majeure event.
- 11.4 If the event of Force Majeure continues for a period more than 30 days, SBI Payments shall be entitled to terminate this Agreement at any time thereafter. Neither party shall have any penal liability to the other in respect of the termination of this Contract as a result of an Event of Force Majeure. However Vendor / service provider shall be entitled to receive payments for all services actually rendered up to the date of the termination of this Agreement.

12 COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS.

- 12.1 Vendor agrees and declares that it shall be the sole responsibility of Vendor to comply with the provisions of all the applicable laws, concerning or in relation to rendering of Services by Vendor as envisaged under this agreement.
- 12.2 Vendor shall procure and maintain all necessary licenses, permissions, approvals from the relevant authorities under the applicable laws throughout the currency of this Agreement, require for performing the Services under this Agreement.
- 12.3 Vendor shall be solely liable & responsible for compliance of applicable

Labour Laws in respect of its employee, agents, representatives and sub-Contractors (if allowed) and in particular laws relating to terminal benefits such as Pension, Gratuity, Provident Fund, Bonus or other benefits to which they may be entitled and the laws relating to Contract Labour, Minimum Wages, etc., and the SBI Payments shall have no liability in these regards.

- 12.4 Vendor shall cooperate fully with any legitimately provided/ constituted body conducting inquiry into processing and execution of this Agreement/ any other matter related with discharge of contractual obligations by Vendor.
- 12.5 Vendor confirms that it has full authority to enter into this Agreement and render the Services as envisaged under this Agreement and all Corporate or other necessary approvals have been obtained for entering into this Agreement with the SBI Payments. Further, the persons executing this Agreement on behalf of Vendor have full authority and power to execute this Agreement and bind Vendor.

13 RIGHT TO AUDIT

13.1 It is agreed by and between the parties that Vendor / service provider shall get itself annually audited by external empaneled Auditors appointed by SBI Payments / inspecting official from the Reserve Bank of India or any regulatory authority, covering the risk parameters finalized by SBI Payments / such auditors in the areas of products (IT hardware/ software) and services etc. provided to SBI Payments and Vendor / service provider shall submit such certification by such Auditors to SBI Payments. Vendor / service provider and or his / their outsourced agents /sub – contractors (if allowed by SBI Payments) shall facilitate the same. SBI Payments can make its expert assessment on the efficiency and effectiveness of the security, control, risk management, governance system and process created by Vendor / service provider. Vendor / service provider shall, whenever required by such Auditors, furnish all relevant in-



formation, records/data to them. All costs for such audit shall be borne by SBI Payments.

- 13.2 Where any deficiency has been observed during audit of Vendor / service provider on the risk parameters finalized by SBI Payments or in the certification submitted by the Auditors, it is agreed upon by Vendor / service provider that it shall correct/ resolve the same at the earliest and shall provide all necessary documents related to resolution thereof and the auditor shall further certify in respect of resolution of the deficiencies. It is also agreed that Vendor / service provider shall provide certification of the auditor to SBI Payments regarding compliance of the observations made by the auditors covering the respective risk parameters against which such deficiencies observed.
- 13.3 Vendor / service provider further agrees that whenever required by SBI Payments, it will furnish all relevant information, records/data to such auditors and/or inspecting officials of SBI Payments / Reserve Bank of India and or any regulatory authority required for conducting the audit. SBI Payments reserves the right to call and/or retain for any relevant material information / reports including audit or review reports undertaken by Vendor / service provider (e.g., financial, internal control and security reviews) and findings made on Vendor / service provider in conjunction with the services provided to SBI Payments.

14 FEES, TAXES DUTIES AND PAYMENTS

14.1 Vendor shall be paid fees and charges in the manner detailed in hereunder, the same shall be subject to deduction of income tax thereon wherever required under the provisions of the Income Tax Act by the SBI Payments. The remittance of amounts so deducted and issuance of certificate for such deductions shall be made by the SBI Payments as per the laws and regulations for the time being in force. Nothing in the Agreement shall relieve Vendor from his responsibility to pay any tax that may be levied in India on income and profits made by Vendor in respect

of this Agreement.

- 14.1.1 SBI Payments agrees to pay the fees as set out in Annexure B ("Fees") to Vendor for the Work/Services being rendered by it, in the manner set out in this Agreement.
- 14.1.2 The Parties agree that the Fees payable in respect of a stage shall be paid as per the detailed billing schedule set out in Annexure B.
- 14.1.3 The Parties agree that all Fees will be billed by and payable in Indian rupees at Mumbai. SBI Payments will pay properly submitted valid invoices within reasonable period but not exceeding 30 (thirty) days after its receipt thereof.
- 14.1.4 SBI Payments may withhold payment of any Services that it disputes in good faith, and may set-off penalty amount or any other amount which Vendor owes to the SBI Payments against amount payable to Vendor under this Agreement. However, before levying penalty or recovery of any damages, the SBI Payments shall provide a written notice to Vendor indicating the reasons for such penalty or recovery of damages. Vendor shall have the liberty to present its case in writing together with documentary evidences, if any, within 30 (Thirty) days. Penalty or damages, if any, recoverable from Vendor shall be recovered by the SBI Payments through a credit note or revised invoices. In case Vendor fails to issue credit note/ revised invoice, the SBI Payments shall have right to withhold the payment or set-off penal amount from current. However, SBI Payments may in its discretion invoke the Performance Bank Guarantee for recovery of Penalty or damages from the Vendor.

14.2 All duties and taxes (excluding	or	any	other	tax

same._____ GST as imposed by the Government in lieu of same shall be borne by the SBI Payments on actual upon production of original receipt wherever required.

14.3 All expenses, stamp duty and other charges/ expenses in connection with execution of this Agreement shall be borne by Vendor.

15 GENERAL INDEMNITY

- 15.1 Vendor agrees and hereby keeps the SBI Payments indemnified against all claims, actions, loss, damages, costs, expenses, charges, including legal expenses (Attorney, Advocates fees included) which the SBI Payments may suffer or incur on account of (i) Services Provider's breach of its warranties, covenants, responsibilities or obligations; or (ii) breach of confidentiality obligations mentioned in this Agreement; or (iii) any willful misconduct and gross negligent acts on the part of employees, agents, representatives or sub-contractors (if allowed) of Vendor. Vendor agrees to make good the loss suffered by the SBI Payments.
- 15.2 Vendor shall be responsible for accuracy of the documents drafted and/ or vetted and data collected by it directly or procured from other agencies/authorities, estimates and all other details prepared by it as part of its Services. Subject to the provisions of Clause 18, it shall indemnify the SBI Payments against any inaccuracy in its work which might surface during implementation of the project, if such inaccuracy is the result of any negligence or inadequate due diligence on part of Vendor or arises out of its failure to conform to good industry practice. Vendor shall also be responsible for promptly correcting, at its own cost and risk, the documents including such inaccuracy.

16 TERMINATION

16.1 SBI Payments may, without prejudice to any other remedy for breach of Agreement, upon written notice of not less than 30 (thirty) days sent to Vendor / service provider, terminate the Agreement in whole or in part:

- 16.1.1 if Vendor / service provider fails to deliver any or all the obligations within the time period specified in the Agreement, or any extension thereof granted by SBI Payments;
- 16.1.2 if Vendor / service provider fails to perform any other obligation(s) under the RFP or this Agreement;
- 16.1.3 if Vendor / service provider violates any terms and conditions stipulated in the RFP or this Agreement;
- 16.1.4 on the happening of any termination event mentioned herein above in this Agreement;
- 16.2 SBI Payments, by written notice of not less than 90 (ninety) days sent to Vendor / service provider, may terminate the Agreement, in whole or in part, at any time for its convenience. The notice of termination shall specify that termination is for SBI Payments' convenience, the extent to which performance of Vendor / service provider under the Agreement is terminated, and the date upon which such termination becomes effective.
- 16.3 SBI Payments shall have a right to terminate the Agreement immediately by giving a notice in writing to Vendor / service provider in the following eventualities:
 - 16.3.1 If any Receiver/Liquidator is appointed in connection with the business of Vendor / service provider or Vendor / service provider transfers substantial assets in favour of its creditors or any orders / directions are issued by any Authority/Regulator which has the effect of suspension of the business of Vendor / service provider.
 - 16.3.2 If Vendor / service provider applies to the Court or passes a resolution for voluntary winding up of Vendor / service provider or any other creditor / person files a petition for winding up or dissolution Vendor / service provider.

- 16.3.3 If Vendor / service provider, in the reasonable opinion of SBI Payments is unable to pay its debts or discharge its liabilities in normal course of business.
- 16.3.4 If Vendor / service provider is unable to render the services up to the mark as envisaged under this Agreement upon a reasonable assessment of the circumstances by SBI Payments which affect rendering of the services by Vendor / service provider as envisaged under this Agreement.
- 16.3.5 If any acts of commission or omission on the part of Vendor / service provider or its agents, employees, sub-contractors or representatives, in the reasonable opinion of SBI Payments tantamount to fraud or prejudicial to the interest of SBI Payments or its customers.
- 16.3.6 If Vendor / service provider is owned/ controlled wholly/ partly by any other third party that has business identical or similar to that of SBI Payments operating in India.
- 16.3.7 If any officer/ employee/ director of Vendor / service provider or their relatives as defined in section 2(77) of the Companies Act, 2013 becomes a director of SBI Payments.
- 16.4 In the event SBI Payments terminates the Agreement in whole or in part for the breaches attributable to Vendor / service provider, it may procure, upon such terms and in such manner as it deems appropriate, products and services similar to those undelivered, and Vendor / service provider shall be liable to SBI Payments for any increase in cost for such similar products and/or services. However, Vendor / service provider shall continue performance of the Agreement to the extent not terminated.
- 16.5 In the event of the termination of the Agreement, Vendor / service provider shall be liable and responsible to return to SBI Payments all records,



documents, data and information including Confidential Information pertains to or relating to SBI Payments in its possession.

- 16.6 In the event of termination of the Agreement for material breach by Vendor / service provider, SBI Payments shall have the right to give suitable publicity to the same including advising the Indian Bank's Association.
- 16.7 In the event of termination of the Agreement or on the expiry of the term/
 renewed term of this Agreement, Vendor / service provider shall render
 all reasonable assistance and help to SBI Payments and any new contractor engaged by SBI Payments for the smooth switch over and continuity of the Services or if so required by SBI Payments take all necessary
 steps to bring the Services to a close in a prompt and orderly manner.
- 16.8 Upon termination or expiration of this Agreement, all rights and obligations of the Parties hereunder shall cease, except:
 - 16.8.1 such rights and obligations as may have accrued on the date of termination or expiration.
 - 16.8.2 the obligation of confidentiality and indemnity; and
 - 16.8.3 any right which a Party may have under the Application Law.

17 LIMITATION ON LIABILITY

- 17.1 For breach of any obligation mentioned in this Agreement, subject to obligations mentioned in clause 17.3, in no event Vendor / service provider shall be liable for damages to SBI Payments arising under or in connection with this Agreement for an amount exceeding the total Cost of the Project i.e. INR (Rupees only).
- 17.2 Vendor / service provider will ensure SBI Payments' data confidentiality and shall be responsible for liability arising in case of breach of any kind of security and/or leakage of confidential customer/SBI Payments' related information to the extent of loss so caused.

- 17.3 The limitations on liability of Vendor / service provider set forth herein shall not apply in circumstances including but not limited to:
 - 17.3.1 claims that are the subject of indemnification pursuant to IPR infringement;
 - 17.3.2 damage(s) occasioned by the gross negligence, fraud or willful misconduct of Vendor / service provider;
 - 17.3.3 damage(s) occasioned by Vendor / service provider for breach of Confidentiality Obligations;
 - 17.3.4 when a dispute is settled by the Court of Law in India;
 - 17.3.5 regulatory or statutory fines imposed by a Government or Regulatory agency for non-compliance of statutory or regulatory guidelines applicable to the SBI PAYMENTS/Bank, provided such guidelines were brought to the notice of Vendor / service provider and non-compliance is due to the vendor.

18 CONTINGENCY PLANS & CONTINUITY ARRANGEMENTS.

- 18.1 Vendor / service provider shall arrange and ensure proper contingency plans to meet any unexpected obstruction to Vendor / service provider or any employees or sub-contractors of Vendor / service provider in rendering the Services or any part of the same under this Agreement to SBI Payments.
- 18.2 Vendor / service provider agrees for the following continuity arrangements to ensure the business continuity of SBI Payments.
 - 18.2.1 In the event of this Agreement comes to end on account of termination or by the expiry of the term/ renewed term of the Agreement or otherwise, Vendor / service provider shall render all reasonable assistance and help to SBI Payments and to any new contractor engaged by SBI Payments, for the smooth switch over and conti-



nuity of the Services.

18.2.2 In the event of failure of Vendor / service provider to render the Services or in the event of termination of agreement or expiry of term or otherwise, without prejudice to any other right, SBI Payments at its sole discretion may make alternate arrangement for getting the Services contracted with another vendor. In such case, SBI Payments shall give prior notice to Vendor / service provider. Vendor / service provider shall continue to provide services as per the terms of this Agreement until a 'New Vendor / service provider' completely takes over the work. During the transition phase, Vendor / service provider shall render all reasonable assistance to the new Vendor / service provider within such period prescribed by SBI Payments, at no extra cost to SBI Payments, for ensuring smooth switch over and continuity of services. If Vendor / service provider is breach of this obligation, they shall be liable for paying a penalty of 10% of the total contract value on demand to SBI Payments, which may be settled from the payment of invoices or performance guarantee for the contracted period.

19 ARBITRATION

19.1 Any and all disputes, controversies and conflicts ("Disputes") arising out of this Agreement or in connection with this Agreement or the performance or non-performance of the rights and obligations set forth herein, or the breach, termination, invalidity or interpretation thereof shall be referred for arbitration in terms of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 (Arbitration Act) or any amendments thereof. Prior to submitting the Disputes to arbitration the parties shall make all endeavors to settle the dispute/s through mutual negotiation and discussions. In the event that the said dispute/s are not settled within 30 days of the arising thereof as evidenced through the first written communication from any party notifying the other regarding the disputes, the same shall finally be settled and determined by arbitration as above.

- 19.2 The place of arbitration shall be at Mumbai and the language used in the arbitral proceedings shall be English. Arbitration shall be conducted by a mutually appointed sole arbitrator. If the Parties are unable to agree upon a sole Arbitrator, each Party shall appoint one arbitrator and the two arbitrators so appointed by the Parties shall appoint the third arbitrator, who shall be the Chairman of the Arbitral Tribunal.
- 19.3 The arbitral award shall be in writing and subject to the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996 Act shall be enforceable in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 19.4 Pending the submission to arbitration and thereafter, till the Arbitrator or the Arbitral Tribunal renders the award or decision, the Parties shall, except in the event of termination of this Agreement or in the event of any interim order/award is granted under the afore stated Act, continue to perform their obligations under this Agreement.

20 GOVERNING LAW AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION

(Governing Law and Jurisdiction)

- 20.1 This Agreement shall be governed by and be construed in accordance with the laws of Republic of India.
- 20.2 The parties agree to submit to the exclusive jurisdiction of appropriate court in Mumbai in connection with any dispute between the parties under the Agreement.

21 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

21.1 This Agreement along with RFP constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior written agreements, undertakings, understandings and negotiations, both written and oral, between the Parties with respect to the subject matter of the Agreement, except which are expressly annexed or attached to this Agreement and saved by this Agreement. No

representation, inducement, promise, understanding, condition or warranty not set forth herein has been made or relied upon by any Party hereto. It is clarified that if any portion of the RFP has been missed out in this Agreement, it shall be deemed to have been included in this Agreement. However, notwithstanding anything to the contrary stated herein, in case of conflict between the contents of the RFP and this Agreement, this Agreement shall prevail.

- 21.2 This Agreement comprises this Agreement and the following Appendices/Addendums/Annexure/Schedules which shall be integral part of this Agreement, and the Parties shall be bound by the terms and conditions contained therein:

- 21.3 If there is any ambiguity between any clause in this Agreement and any clause in any of the Appendices/Annexure, etc., or any ambiguity among the Appendices, Annexure, etc., the order of priority of documents in resolving such ambiguity shall be as follows:
 - 21.3.1 This Agreement
 - 21.3.2 RFP

22 CONFLICT OF INTEREST

22.1 Vendor shall not receive any remuneration in connection with the as-



signment except as provided in the Contract.

22.2 Vendor shall provide professional, objective and impartial advice and at all times hold the SBI Payments' interests paramount, strictly avoiding conflicts with other assignment(s)/job(s) or their own corporate interests, and act without any expectation/ consideration for award of any future assignment(s) from the SBI Payments. Vendor shall avoid any conflict of interest while discharging contractual obligations and bring, before-hand, any possible instance of conflict of interest to the knowledge of the SBI Payments, while rendering Services under the Agreement.

23 SEVERABILITY

23.1 If any part or any provision of this Agreement is or becomes illegal, invalid or unenforceable, that part or provision shall be ineffective to the extent of such invalidity or unenforceability only, without in any way affecting the validity or enforceability of the remaining parts of said provision or the remaining provisions of this Agreement. The Parties hereby agree to attempt to substitute any invalid or unenforceable provision with a valid or enforceable provision, which achieves to the greatest extent possible the economic, legal and commercial objectives of the invalid or unenforceable provision.

24 PATENT RIGHTS / INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- 24.1 For any licensed software/firmware used by the finally selected Vendor for performing services, the Vendor shall have the right as well as the right to license for the outsourced services. The vendor shall, if applicable, furnish a photocopy of the Agreement with their Principals/OEM in respect of 'Product' and services offered. Any license or IPR violation on the part of Vendor should not put the SBI Payments/Bank at risk. The SBI Payments/Bank reserves the right to audit the license usage of the Vendor.
- 24.2 The Vendor shall, at its own expenses without any limitation, defend and indemnify the SBI Payments/Bank against all third party claims

or infringements of intellectual Property Rights including patent, trademark, copyright, trade secret or industrial design rights arising from use of the products or any part thereof in India or abroad. In case of violation/ infringement of patent/ trademark/ copyright/ trade secret or industrial design, the supplier shall after due inspection and testing get the solution redesigned for the SBI Payments/Bank, at no extra cost.

- 24.3 The Vendor shall expeditiously extinguish any such claims and shall have full rights to defend itself there from. If the SBI Payments/Bank is required to pay compensation to a third party resulting from such infringement(s), the Vendor shall be fully responsible therefore, including all expenses and court and legal fees.
- 24.4 SBI Payments will give notice to the Vendor of any such claim without delay, provide reasonable assistance to the vendor in disposing of the claim, and shall at no time admit to any liability for or express any intent to settle the claim.
- 24.5 Vendor agrees that all data or information supplied by SBI Payments to Vendor and/or the consultancy team in connection with the provision of Services by it shall remain the property of the SBI Payments or its licensors.
- 24.6 Any licensed material used by Vendor for performing Services or developing Work Product SBI Payments, Vendor should have right to use as well as right to license for the outsourced services. SBI Payments shall not be liable for any license or IPR violation on the part of Vendor.
- 24.7 Subject to below mentioned sub-clause (45.4) and (45.5) of this RFP, Vendor shall, at its own expenses without any limitation, indemnify and keep fully and effectively indemnified SBI Payments against all costs, claims, damages, demands, expenses and liabilities of whatsoever nature arising out of or in connection with all

claims of infringement of Intellectual Property Rights, including patent, trademark, copyright, trade secret or industrial design rights of any third party arising from the Services or use of Work Product or any part thereof in India or abroad under this RFP.

- 24.8 SBI Payments will give (a) notice to Vendor of any such claim without delay/provide reasonable assistance to Vendor in disposing of the claim; (b) sole authority to defend and settle such claim and; (c) will at no time admit to any liability for or express any intent to settle the claim provided that (i) Vendor shall not partially settle any such claim without the written consent of SBI Payments, unless such settlement releases SBI Payments fully from such claim, (ii) Vendor shall promptly provide the SBI Payments with copies of all pleadings or similar documents relating to any such claim, (iii) Vendor shall consult with the SBI Payments with respect to the defense and settlement of any such claim, and (iv) in any litigation to which the SBI Payments is also a party, the SBI Payments shall be entitled to be separately represented at its own expenses by counsel of its own selection.
- 24.9 Vendor shall have no obligations with respect to any infringement claims to the extent that the infringement claim arises or results from: (i) Vendor's compliance with the SBI Payments 's specific technical designs or instructions (except where Vendor knew or should have known that such compliance was likely to result in an infringement claim and Vendor did not inform the SBI Payments of the same); or (ii) any unauthorized modification or alteration of the Work Product by the SBI Payments.
- 24.10 All Work Product prepared by the Vendor in performing the Services shall become and remain the sole and exclusive property of the SBI Payments and all Intellectual Property Rights in such Work Product shall vest with the SBI Payments. Any Work Product, of which the ownership or the Intellectual Property Rights do not vest with the SBI

Payments under law, shall automatically stand assigned to the SBI Payments as and when such Work Product is created and Vendor agrees to execute all papers and to perform such other acts as the SBI Payments may deem necessary to secure its rights herein assigned by Vendor. The Work Product shall not be used for any purpose other than intended under the scope of work, without prior written consent of the SBI Payments.

- 24.11 In the event that Vendor integrates any work that was previously created by Vendor into any Work Product, Vendor shall grant to, and the SBI Payments is hereby granted, a worldwide, royalty-free, perpetual, irrevocable license to utilize the incorporated items, including, but not limited to, any and all copyrights, patents, designs, trade secrets, trademarks or other Intellectual Property Rights, in connection with the Work Product.
- 24.12 Vendor agrees that the SBI Payments owns the entire right, title and interest to any inventions, designs, discoveries, writings and works of authorship, including all intellectual property rights, copyrights. Any work made under this RFP shall be deemed to be 'work made for hire' under any Indian/U.S. or any other applicable copyright laws.
- 24.13 The Intellectual Property Rights on the software code, copyright and source code for various applications/ interfaces developed under this RFP, and any other component/ framework/ middleware used/ developed as pre-built software assets to deliver the solution, shall belong to the SBI Payments and the SBI Payments shall have complete and unrestricted rights on such property. However, Vendor shall hold All Intellectual Property rights in any pre-built software per se, except for those which have been assigned under this RFP.
- 24.14 All information processed by Vendor during software maintenance belongs to the SBI Payments . Vendor shall not acquire any other right in respect of the information for the license to the rights owned

by the SBI Payments . Vendor will implement mutually agreed controls to protect the information. Vendor also agrees that it will protect the information appropriately.

24.15 Data Protection:

The Bidder shall process SBI Payments' personal data solely on behalf of SBI Payments and strictly for the purposes of providing the Services, and only to the extent permissible under the Scope of work and the applicable law. The Bidder shall comply with the Information Technology Act, 2000, the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023, and all other applicable privacy and data protection laws and regulations.

The Bidder shall exercise due care in the collection, processing, storage, and handling of sensitive personal data or information, ensuring compliance with all obligations under the DPDP Act and related rules. All personal data related to SBI Payments shall be stored exclusively within SBI Payments' premises and within the territorial boundaries of India.

Any web portal or digital interface used by Bidder to access, process, or procure SBI Payments' data must be secured with industry-standard security measures to prevent unauthorized access, hacking, malware, data breaches, unauthorized copying, tampering, or any other form of data compromise. The Bidder shall implement and maintain all necessary technical and organizational security measures as required under applicable laws, regulations, and best practices to ensure the confidentiality, integrity, and security of SBI Payments' data.

25 LIQUIDATED DAMAGES

If Vendor fails to perform any or all the Services within the stipulated time, schedule as specified in this Agreement, the SBI Payments may, without prejudice to its other remedies under the Agreement,

and unless otherwise extension of time is agreed upon without the application of liquidated damages, deduct from the Project Cost, as liquidated damages, a sum equivalent to 0.5 % of the total Project Cost for delay of each week or part thereof maximum up to 5% of total Project Cost. Once the maximum deduction is reached, SBI Payments may consider termination of Agreement.

26 NOTICES

- a. Any notice or any other communication required to be given under this Agreement shall be in writing and may be given by delivering the same by hand or sending the same by prepaid registered mail, postage prepaid, telegram or facsimile to the relevant address set forth below or such other address as each Party may notify in writing to the other Party from time to time. Any such notice given as aforesaid shall be deemed to be served or received at the time upon delivery (if delivered by hand) or upon actual receipt (if given by postage prepaid, telegram or facsimile).
- b. A notice shall be effective when it is delivered or on the effective date of the notice, whichever is later.
 - c. Address for communication to the Parties are as under:

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d. In case there is any change in the address of one party, it shall be promptly communicated in writing to the other party.

- a. Any provision of this Agreement may be amended or waived, if, and only if such amendment or waiver is in writing and signed, in the case of an amendment by each party, or in this case of a waiver, by the Party against whom the waiver is to be effective.
- b. No failure or delay by any Party in exercising any right, power or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof nor shall any single or partial exercise of any other right, power of privilege. The rights and remedies herein provided shall be cumulative and not exclusive of any rights or remedies provided by law.
- c. Neither this Agreement nor any provision hereof is intended to confer upon any person/s other than the Parties to this Agreement any rights or remedies hereunder.
- d. If this Agreement is signed in counterparts, each counterpart shall be deemed to be an original.
- e. Vendor shall not assign or transfer all or any of its rights, benefits or obligations under this Agreement without the approval of the SBI Payments. The SBI Payments may, at any time, assign or transfer all or any of its rights, benefits and obligations under this Agreement.
- f. Vendor agrees that it shall not use the logo, trademark, copy rights or other proprietary rights of the SBI Payments in any advertisement or publicity materials or any other written communication with any other party, without the prior written consent of the SBI Payments.
- g. During the term of this Agreement and for a one year thereafter,

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neither party shall (either directly or indirectly through a third party) employ, solicit to employ, cause to be solicited for the purpose of employment or offer employment to any employee/s or sub-contractor/s of the other party, or aid any third person to do so. However, nothing in this clause shall affect the SBI Payments's regular recruitments as per its recruitment policy and not targeted to the employees of Vendor.

h. Vendor agrees that the SBI Payments shall have the right to disclose the details of this Agreement and the details of Services covered herein to the Reserve SBI Payments of India and Indian SBI Payments Association.

This level would typically correspond to issues that result into disruption of one or more critical services to all the SBI Payments, Regulated entity offices and external institutions having an access.

Low: The incidents would be termed as low, which does not have any significant impact on the business or functionality.

- Successful Bidder needs to send support engineer to the SBI Payments office in case incident resolution needs onsite support.

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES AS UNDER

1. Confidential Information and Confidential Materials:

- (a) "Confidential Information" means non-public information that Disclosing Party designates as being confidential or which, under the circumstances surrounding disclosure ought to be treated as confidential. "Confidential Information" includes, without limitation, information relating to installed or purchased Disclosing Party software or hardware products, the information relating to general architecture of Disclosing Party's network, information relating to nature and content of data stored within network or in any other storage media, Disclosing Party's business policies, practices, methodology, policy design delivery, and information received from others that Disclosing Party is obligated to treat as confidential. Confidential Information disclosed to Receiving Party by any Disclosing Party Subsidiary and/ or agents is covered by this agreement
- (b) Confidential Information shall not include any information that: (i) is or subsequently becomes publicly available without Receiving Party's breach of any obligation owed to Disclosing party; (ii) becomes known to Receiving Party prior to Disclosing Party's disclosure of such information to Receiving Party; (iii) became known to Receiving Party from a source other than Disclosing Party other than by the breach of an obligation of confidentiality owed to Disclosing Party; or (iv) is independently developed by Receiving Party.
- (c) "Confidential Materials" shall mean all tangible materials containing Confidential Information, including without limitation written or printed documents and computer disks or tapes, whether machine or user readable.

2. **Restrictions**

(a) Each party shall treat as confidential the Contract and any and all information ("confidential information") obtained from the other pursuant to the Contract and shall not divulge such information to any person (except to such party's own employees and other persons and then only to those employees and persons who need to know the same) without the other party's written consent provided that this clause shall not extend to information which was rightfully in the possession of such party prior to the commencement of the negotiations leading to the Contract, which is already

public knowledge or becomes so at a future date (otherwise than as a result of a breach of this clause). Receiving Party will have executed or shall execute appropriate written agreements with its employees and consultants specifically assigned and/or otherwise, sufficient to enable it to comply with all the provisions of this Agreement. If the Vendor shall appoint any Sub-Contractor then the Vendor may disclose confidential information to such Sub-Contractor subject to such Sub Contractor giving the SBI PAYMENTS an undertaking in similar terms to the provisions of this clause.

- (b) Receiving Party may disclose Confidential Information in accordance with judicial or other governmental order to the intended recipients (as detailed in this clause), provided Receiving Party shall give Disclosing Party reasonable notice prior to such disclosure and shall comply with any applicable protective order or equivalent. The intended recipients for this purpose are:
- (1) the statutory auditors of the SBI PAYMENTS and
- (2) regulatory authorities regulating the affairs of the SBI PAYMENTS and inspectors and supervisory bodies thereof
- (c) The foregoing obligations as to confidentiality shall survive any termination of this Agreement
- (d) Confidential Information and Confidential Material may be disclosed, reproduced, summarized or distributed only in pursuance of Receiving Party's business relationship with Disclosing Party, and only as otherwise provided hereunder. Receiving Party agrees to segregate all such Confidential Material from the confidential material of others in order to prevent mixing.
- (e) Receiving Party may not reverse engineer, decompile or disassemble any software disclosed to Receiving Party.

3. Rights and Remedies

- (a) Receiving Party shall notify Disclosing Party immediately upon discovery of any unauthorized used or disclosure of Confidential Information and/ or Confidential Materials, or any other breach of this Agreement by Receiving Party, and will cooperate with Disclosing Party in every reasonable way to help Disclosing Party regain possession of the Confidential Information and/ or Confidential Materials and prevent its further unauthorized use.
- (b) Receiving Party shall return all originals, copies, reproductions and summaries of Confidential Information or Confidential Materials at Disclosing Party's request, or at Disclosing Party's option, certify destruction of the same.

- (c) Receiving Party acknowledges that monetary damages may not be the only and / or a sufficient remedy for unauthorized disclosure of Confidential Information and that disclosing party shall be entitled, without waiving any other rights or remedies (as listed below), to injunctive or equitable relief as may be deemed proper by a Court of competent jurisdiction.
- a. Suspension of access privileges
- b. Change of personnel assigned to the job
- c. Financial liability for actual, consequential or incidental damages
- d. Termination of contract

- (b) Any document provided under this Agreement is provided with RESTRICTED RIGHTS.
- (c) Neither party grants to the other party any license, by implication or otherwise, to use the Confidential Information, other than for the limited purpose of evaluating or advancing a business relationship between the parties, or any license rights whatsoever in any patent, copyright or other intellectual property rights pertaining to the Confidential Information.
- (d) The terms of Confidentiality under this Agreement shall not be construed to limit either party's right to independently develop or acquire product without use of the other party's Confidential Information. Further, either party shall be free to use for any purpose the residuals resulting from access to or work with such Confidential Information, provided that such party shall maintain the confidentiality of the Confidential Information as provided herein. The term "residuals" means information in non-tangible form, which may be retained by person who has had access to the Confidential Information, including ideas, concepts, know-how or techniques contained therein. Neither party shall have any obligation to limit or restrict the assignment of such persons or to pay royalties for any work resulting from the use of residuals. However, the foregoing shall not be deemed to grant to either party a license under the other party's copyrights or patents.

OSBI Payments

- (e) This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof. It shall not be modified except by a written agreement dated subsequently to the date of this Agreement and signed by both parties. None of the provisions of this Agreement shall be deemed to have been waived by any act or acquiescence on the part of Disclosing Party, its agents, or employees, except by an instrument in writing signed by an authorized officer of Disclosing Party. No waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of any other provision(s) or of the same provision on another occasion.
- (f) In case of any dispute, both the parties agree for neutral third party arbitration. Such arbitrator will be jointly selected by the two parties and he/she may be an auditor, lawyer, consultant or any other person of trust. The said proceedings shall be conducted in English language at Mumbai and in accordance with the provisions of Indian Arbitration and Conciliation Act 1996 or any Amendments or Re-enactments thereto.
- (g) Subject to the limitations set forth in this Agreement, this Agreement will inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the parties, their successors and assigns.
- (h) If any provision of this Agreement shall be held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
- (i) All obligations created by this Agreement shall survive change or termination of the parties' business relationship.

5. Suggestions and Feedback

(a) Either party from time to time may provide suggestions, comments or other feedback to the other party with respect to Confidential Information provided originally by the other party (hereinafter "feedback"). Both party agree that all Feedback is and shall be entirely voluntary and shall not in absence of separate agreement, create any confidentially obligation for the receiving party. However, the Receiving Party shall not disclose the source of any feedback without the providing party's consent. Feedback shall be clearly designated as such and, except as otherwise provided herein, each party shall be free to disclose and use such Feedback as it sees fit, entirely without obligation of any kind to other party. The foregoing shall not, however, affect either party's obligations hereunder with respect to Confidential Information of other party.

- ➤ Enabling BIDDERs to abstain from bribing or indulging in any corrupt practice in order to secure the contract by providing assurance to them that their competitors will also abstain from bribing and other corrupt practices and the BUYER will commit to prevent corruption, in any farm, by its officials by following transparent procedures.

The parties hereto hereby agree to enter into this Integrity Pact and agree as follows:

Commitments of the BUYER

- 1.1 The BUYER undertakes that no official of the BUYER, connected directly or indirectly with the contract, will demand, take a promise for or accept, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, consideration, gift, reward, favour or any material or immaterial benefit or any other advantage from the BIDDER, either for themselves or for any person, organisation or third party related to the contract in exchange for an advantage in the bidding process, Bid evaluation, contracting or implementation process related to the contract.
- 1.2 The BUYER will, during the pre-contract stage, treat all BIDDERs alike, and will provide to all BIDDERs the same information and will not provide any such information to any particular BIDDER which could afford an advantage to that particular BIDDER in comparison to other B1DDERs.
- 1.3 All the officials of the BUYER will report to the appropriate authority any attempted or completed breaches of the above commitments as well as any substantial suspicion of such a breach.
- 1.4 In case any such preceding misconduct on the part of such official(s) is reported by the BIDDER to the BUYER with full and verifiable facts and the same is prima facie found to be correct by the BUYER, necessary

disciplinary proceedings, or any other action as deemed fit, including criminal proceedings may be initiated by the BUYER and such a person shall be debarred from further dealings related to the contract process. In such a case while an enquiry is being conducted by the BUYER the proceedings under the contract would not be stalled.

2. Commitments of BIDDERs

- 2.1 The BIDDER commits itself to take all measures necessary to prevent corrupt practices, unfair means and illegal activities during any stage of its Bid or during any pre-contract or post-contract stage in order to secure the contract or in furtherance to secure it and in particular commit itself to the following:
- The BIDDER will not offer, directly or through intermediaries, any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any official of the BUYER, connected directly or indirectly with the bidding process, or to any person, organisation or third party related to the contract in exchange for any advantage in the bidding, evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- 2.3 The BIDDER further undertakes that it has not given, offered or promised to give, directly or indirectly any bribe, gift, consideration, reward, favour, any material or immaterial benefit or other advantage, commission, fees, brokerage or inducement to any official of the BUYER or otherwise in procuring the Contract or forbearing to do or having done any act in relation to the obtaining or execution of the contract or any other contract with State Bank of India for showing or forbearing to show favour or disfavour to any person in relation to the contract or any other contract with State Bank of India.
- 2.4 Wherever applicable, the BIDDER shall disclose the name and address of agents and representatives permitted by the Bid documents and Indian BIDDERs shall disclose their foreign principals or associates, if any.
- 2.5 The BIDDER confirms and declares that they have not made any

- payments to any agents/brokers or any other intermediary, in connection with this Bid/contract.
- 2.6 The BIDDER further confirms and declares to the BUYER that the BIDDER is the original Vendors or Vendors in respect of product / service covered in the Bid documents and the BIDDER has not engaged any individual or firm or company whether Indian or foreign to intercede, facilitate or in any way to recommend to the BUYER or any of its functionaries, whether officially or unofficially to the award of the contract to the BIDDER, nor has any amount been paid, promised or intended to be paid to any such individual, firm or company in respect of any such intercession, facilitation or recommendation.
- 2.7 The BIDDER, at the earliest available opportunity, i.e. either while presenting the Bid or during pre-contract negotiations and in any case before opening the financial Bid and before signing the contract, shall disclose any payments he has made, is committed to or intends to make to officials of the BUYER or their family members, agents, brokers or any other intermediaries in connection with the contract and the details of services agreed upon for such payments.
- 2.8 The BIDDER will not collude with other parties interested in the contract to impair the transparency, fairness and progress of the bidding process, Bid evaluation, contracting and implementation of the contract.
- 2.9 The BIDDER will not accept any advantage in exchange for any corrupt practice, unfair means and illegal activities.
- 2.10 The BIDDER shall not use improperly, for purposes of competition or personal gain, or pass. on 'to' others, any 'information provided by the BUYER as part of the business relationship, regarding plans, technical proposals and business details, including information contained in any electronic data carrier. The BIDDER also undertakes to exercise due and adequate care lest any such information is divulged.
- 2.11 The BIDDER commits to refrain from giving any complaint directly or through any other manner without supporting it with full and verifiable



facts.

- 2.12 The BIDDER shall not instigate or cause to instigate any third person to commit any of the actions mentioned above.
- 2.13 If the BIDDER or any employee of the BIDDER or any person acting on behalf of the BIDDER, either directly or indirectly, is a relative of any of the officers of the BUYER, or alternatively, if any relative of an officer of the BUYER has financial Interest/stake in the BIDDER's firm, the same shall be disclosed by the BIDDER at the time of filing of tender. The term 'relative' for this purpose would be as defined in Section 6 of the Companies Act 1956.
- 2.14 The BIDDER shall not lend to or borrow any money from or enter into any monetary dealings or transactions, directly or indirectly, with any employee of the BUYER.

3. Previous Transgression

- 3.1 The BIDDER declares that no previous transgression occurred in the last three years immediately before signing of this Integrity Pact, with any other company in any country in respect of any corrupt practices envisaged hereunder or with any Public Sector Enterprise / Public Sector Banks in India or any Government Department in India or RBI that could justify BIDDER's exclusion from the tender process.
- 3.2 The BIDDER agrees that if it makes incorrect statement on this subject, BIDDER can be disqualified from the tender process or the contract, if already awarded, can be terminated for such reason.

4. Earnest Money (Security Deposit)

4.1 While submitting commercial Bid, the BIDDER shall deposit an amount (specified in RFP) as Earnest Money/Security Deposit, with the BUYER through the mode of Bank Guarantee as mentioned in the RFP / Bid document in favour of SBI Payment Services Pvt Ltd from a nationalized Bank including SBI or its Subsidiary Banks. However payment of any such amount by way of Bank Guarantee, if so permitted

as per Bid documents / RFP should be from any nationalized Bank other than SBI or its Subsidiary Banks and promising payment of the guaranteed sum to the BUYER on demand within three working days without any demur whatsoever and without seeking any reasons whatsoever. The demand for payment by the BUYER shall be treated as conclusive proof for making such payment to the BUYER.

- 4.2 Unless otherwise stipulated in the Bid document / RFP, the Earnest Money/Security Deposit shall be valid up to a period of five years or the complete conclusion of the contractual obligations to the complete satisfaction of both the BIDDER and the BUYER, including warranty period, whichever is later.
- 4.3 In case of the successful BIDDER a clause would also be incorporated in the Article pertaining to Performance Bond in the Purchase Contract that the provisions of Sanctions for Violation shall be applicable for forfeiture of Performance Bond in case of a decision by the BUYER to forfeit the same without assigning any reason for imposing sanction for violation of this Pact.
- 4.4 No interest shall be payable by the BUYER to the BIDDER on Earnest Money/Security Deposit for the period of its currency.

5. Sanctions for Violations

- 5.1 Any breach of the aforesaid provisions by the BIDDER or any one employed by it or acting on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the BIDDER) shall entitle the BUYER to take all or any one of the following actions, wherever required:
- i. To immediately call off the pre contract negotiations without assigning any reason and without giving any compensation to the BIDDER. However, the proceedings with the other BIDDER(s) would continue, unless the BUYER desires to drop the entire process.
 - ii. The Earnest Money Deposit (in pre-contract stage) and/or Security Deposit/Performance Bond (after the contract is signed) shall stand forfeited either fully or partially, as decided by the BUYER and the

BUYER shall not be required to assign any reason therefore.

To immediately cancel the contract, if already signed, without giving any compensation to the BIDDER.

- iii. To recover all sums already paid by the BUYER, and in case of an Indian BIDDER with interest thereon at 2% higher than the prevailing Base Rate of State Bank of India, while in case of a BIDDER from a country other than India with interest thereon at 2% higher than the LIBOR. If any outstanding payment is due to the BIDDER from the BUYER in connection with any other contract for any other stores, such outstanding could also be utilized to recover the aforesaid sum and interest.
 - iv. To encash the advance Bank guarantee and performance bond/warranty bond, if furnished by the BIDDER, in order to recover the payments, already made by the BUYER, along with interest.
 - v. To cancel all or any other Contracts with the BIDDER. The BIDDER shall be liable to pay compensation for any loss or damage to the BUYER resulting from such cancellation/rescission and the BUYER shall be entitled to deduct the amount so payable from the money(s) due to the BIDDER.
 - vi. To debar the BIDDER from participating in future bidding processes of the BUYER or any of its Subsidiaries for a minimum period of five years, which may be further extended at the discretion of the BUYER.
 - vii. To recover all sums paid, in violation of this Pact, by BIDDER(s) to any middleman or agent or broker with a view to securing the contract.
 - viii. Forfeiture of Performance Bond in case of a decision by the BUYER to forfeit the same without assigning any reason for imposing sanction for violation of this Pact.
 - x. Intimate to the CVC, IBA, RBI, as the BUYER deemed fit the details of such events for appropriate action by such authorities.
 - 5.2 The BUYER will be entitled to take all or any of the actions mentioned at para 6.1(i) to (x) of this Pact also on the Commission by the BIDDER or any one employed by it or acting on its behalf (whether with or without the knowledge of the BIDDER), of an offence as defined in Chapter IX of the

Indian Penal code, 1860 or Prevention of Corruption Act, 1988 or any other statute enacted for prevention of corruption.

5.3 The decision of the BUYER to the effect that a breach of the provisions of this Pact has been committed by the BIDDER shall be final and conclusive on the BIDDER.

6. Fall Clause

The BIDDER undertakes that it has not supplied/is not supplying similar product/ systems or subsystems with same or higher configuration at a price lower than that offered in the present Bid to any other PSU Bank /Pvt Bank/Fintech companies, if the quantity is equivalent or lesser than this RFP. Annexure S

GOI GUIDELINES WITH MODEL WISE CLASSIFICATION

Government has issued Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) [PPP-MII] Order 2017 vide the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) Order No.P-45021/2/2017-B.E.-II dated 15.06.2017 and subsequent revisions vide Order No. 45021/2/2017-PP(BE-II) dated 16-9-2020 to encourage 'Make in India' and to promote manufacturing and production of goods, services and works in India with a view to enhancing income and employment.

It is clarified that for all intents and purposes, the latest revised order i.e. the order dated 16-9-2020 shall be applicable being revised Order of the original order i.e. Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) [PPP-MII] Order 2017 dated 15-6-2017.

The salient features of the aforesaid Order are as under:

- 1. Class-I Local supplier a supplier or vendor / service provider, whose goods, services or works offered for procurement, has local content equal to or more than 50%.
- 2. Class-II Local supplier a supplier or vendor / service provider, whose goods, services or works offered for procurement, has local content equal to or more than 20% but less than 50%.
- 3. Non-Local supplier a supplier or vendor / service provider, whose goods, services or works offered for procurement, has local content less than or equal to 20%.
- 4. The margin of purchase preference shall be 20 %., Margin of purchase preference means the maximum extent to which the price quoted by a local supplier may be above the L1 for the purpose of purchase preference.
- 5. "Minimum Local content" for the purpose of this RFP, the 'local content' requirement to categorize a supplier as 'Class-I local supplier' is minimum 50%. For 'Class-II local supplier', the 'local content' requirement is minimum 20%. If Nodal Ministry/Department has prescribed different percentage of minimum 'local content' requirement to categorize a supplier as 'Class-I local supplier', 'Class-II local supplier', same shall be applicable.

Verification of Local contents:

The local supplier at the time of submission of bid shall be required to provide a certificate from the statutory auditor or cost auditor of the company (in the case of companies) or from a practicing cost accountant or practicing chartered

accountant (in respect of suppliers other than companies) giving the percentage of local content as per Annexure 1G. Local content certificate shall be issued based upon the procedure for calculating the local content /domestic value addition on the basis of notification bearing no. F. No.33(1) /2017-IPHW dated 14-9-2017 issued by Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology read with Public Procurement (Preference to Make in India) Order 2017 Revised vide the Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT) Order No.P-45021/2/2017-B.E.-II dated 16-09-2020.

False declaration will be in breach of the Code of Integrity under Rule 175(i)(h) of the General Financial Rules for which a bidder or its successors can be debarred for up to two years as per rule 151 of the General Financial Rules along with such other actions may be permissible under law.

A supplier who has been debarred by any procuring entity for violation of this order shall not be eligible for preference under this order for procurement by any other procuring entity for the duration of the debarments. The debarment for such other procuring entities shall take effect prospectively from the date on which it comes to the notice of other procurement entities in the manner prescribed under order No P-45021/2/2017-PP(BE II) dated 16-09-2020, para 9(h).

- Among all qualified bids, the lowest bid will be termed as L1. If L1 is 'Class-I local supplier', the contract for full quantity will be awarded to L1.
- If L1 bid is not a 'Class-I local supplier', 50% of the order quantity shall be awarded to L1. Thereafter, the lowest bidder among the 'Class-I local supplier' will be invited to match the L1 price for the remaining 50% quantity subject to the Class-I local supplier's quoted price falling within the margin of purchase preference, and contract for that quantity shallbe awarded to such 'Class-I local supplier' subject to matching the L1 price. In case such lowest eligible 'Class-I local supplier' fails to match the L1 price or accepts less than the offered quantity, the next higher 'Class-I local supplier' within the margin of purchase preference shall be invited to match the L1 price for remaining quantity and so on, and contract shall be awarded accordingly. In case some quantity is still left uncovered on Class-I local suppliers, then such balance quantity may also be ordered on the L1 bidder.

- If L1 is not 'Class-I local supplier', the lowest bidder among the 'Class-I local supplier', will be invited to match the L1 price subject to Class-I local supplier's quoted price falling within the margin of purchase preference, and the contract shall be awarded to such 'Class-I local supplier' subject to matching the L1 price.
- In case such lowest eligible 'Class-I local supplier' fails to match the L1 price, the 'Class-I local supplier' with the next higher bid within the margin of purchase preference shall be invited to match the L1 price and so on and contract shall be awarded accordingly. In case none of the 'Class-I local supplier' within the margin of purchase preference matches the L1 price, the contract may be awarded to the L1 bidder.
- 4. "Class-2 local supplier" will not get purchase preference in any procurement, undertaken by procuring entities.
